Lanikai I finished in 2 hours, 36 minutes and 25 seconds. Outrigger Canoe Club I was second in 2:37.32 and Waikiki Surf I third in 2:41.51.

Outrigger crews also won titles in the koa (2:48.51) and masters (2:53.15) divisions. Kailua was first in the senior

masters race at 2:58.52.
