Koloa, Hanalei brave nature

It started out as a competition between the Koloa and Hanalei Canoe Clubs, but ended in a battle against nature.

In a rarely-run double-hulled race. Koloa and Hanalei started out from Poipu Beach Park on their way to Kukuiula Harbor and back. The normal outriggers were taken off and two hulls were connected catamaran-style by two anue nues (connecting beams) lashed to the hulls.

Race starter Jeff Apo stood on the end of the natural lava rock jetty that shelters the cove at Poipu Beach. He held the red stand-by flag aloft. The green goflag was pointed to the ground at his side while the two double hulled canoes waited outside the reef. Simultaneously, he lowered the red flag and raised the green flag over

The two double-hulled canoes. six paddlers manning each hull,

were off. The lead paddlers in each hull set a strong, deliberate pace for the approximately eight-mile course to the harbor and back.

Koloa took the inside track, closer to the reef and the breaking waves, while Hanalei stayed outside, well clear of the peaking swells.

outside the Beach House Restaurant, a little more than half way to the harbor, a small wave broadsided Koloa. Water rushed into the fiberglass

As both canoes were passing

hulls. A couple of paddlers manned buckets and began bailing furiously, while the others kept their pace, maintaining forward progress.

Up until this point, the two clubs had been neck and neck, with Koloa taking the lead just before they took on water at P.K.'s. This handicap now gave Hanalei the edge it needed to inch ahead.

Approaching the harbor-the halfway point in the race-Hanalei impulsively took a shorter but

making the halfway turn, then headed for the distressed canoe adrift in the critical zone. Koloa picked up two of the Hanalei crew who were swimming shoreward, and the two canoes headed for the landing together. Koloa docked at the pier and helped the Hanalei crew take their canoe from the water. Under the impact of a series of waves, one of the anue nues cracked and the canoe was no longer seaworthy.

An air of camaraderie circulated between the two clubs, generated by the display of sportsmanship

seen that morning. With the Hanalei crew safely ashore, Koloa set out on the return leg. By now, the trades had picked up considerably, and Koloa paddled homeward against nearblinding wind and wave conditions.

As Koloa entered the bay at Point finishing the race, the Hanalei club stood by on the beach enthusiastically cheering them

Koloa took first place, but their celebration was as much for a race safely completed as for their victory over one of the premiere distance-racing clubs in the state.

Hanalei will have a chance to redeem itself on Saturday morning, July 6, in its own Tai Hook Regatta to be held at Hanalei Bay.

kiki Beach Boys. "They enter the majority of races. If you only have 20 crews, you have to win most of your races to beat Ka Mo'i.'

That Ka Mo'i is well-stocked with paddlers is nothing new. "We've always had numbers," said State Rep. Peter Apo, a Ka Mo'i assistant coach. "This year, we have more quality."

Apo said his club's success can be traced to two factors the recent purchase of two fiberglass canoes and a change in paddling techniques.

Kaaekuahiwi said the new canoes were molded after Ka Mo'i's koa canoe and are longer (43 feet, 3 inches) than the club's old fiberglass canoes.

Kaaekuahiwi said more length provides more quickness in the straightaways.

Kaaekuahiwi also said his coaches instruct paddlers to use quicker strokes. He said some of the top clubs on Oahu have increased their average strokes per minute to as many as 74. Before, 50 strokes per minute was considered fast.

"We're trying to blend sprint techniques with distance techniques," Kaaekuahiwi said.

At Keehi Lagoon yesterday, Outrigger Canoe Club scored a season-high 116 points to win the Healani Regatta of the Oahu Hawaiian Čanoe Racing Association. It was the fourth week in a row that OCC has scored 100 or more points.

Kailua was second with 60 points and Hui Nalu third with
