10 paddling clubs entered in John Kekua Sr. Regatta

The John Kekua Sr. Outrigger Canoe Racing Regatta closes out the East Hawaii paddling season tomorrow beginning at 9 a.m. at Hilo Bayfront.

The regatta is sponsored by the Kamehameha Canoe Club of Hilo and is named after John C. Kekua Sr., a founder of the Kamehameha C.C. All ten active Moku O Hawaii clubs have drawn lanes for the event, including defending champion Kai O Pua, Kawaihae, and hosts Kamehameha, which have drawn lanes for all 27 events.

A total of six crews still remain undefeated for all five races this season. They are host Kamehameha's junior men, Keoua's senior women, Kai O Pua's girl's 18, Kai e Hitu's novice women B, Kawaihae's novice women B, and Keaukaha's

boy's 13.

After dropping the Kawaihae Regatta, the traditional opener for the Moku O Hawaii season, Kai O Pua has won all four other regattas this year, last weekend the Waiani Regatta, also held at Hilo Bay.

An addition to the race will be the one-man sprint races held at 7 a.m. The event is a qualifier for the U.S. sprint championships, to be held next year on Oahu.

After the Kekua Regatta will be the Tutu Clara Regatta July 11 in Kailua Bay, and then the Moku O Hawaii championships on July 18, which have been switched to Kawaihae from Kailua because of problems with boats moored in the bay.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.—The Outrigger Canoe Club Juniors and Kamali Volleyball Club are still alive in boys' 17-and-under competition at the U.S. Junior Volleyball Nationals.

OCC split its two championship bracket games yesterday, winning by forfeit over Whips of Pittsburgh while losing to Malibu (Calif.) East, 15-11, 15-13. The split gave OCC the No. 10 seed going into the 12-team double elimination final and OCC then upset No. 7 Palisades Gold, 15-11, 15-12, to advance to today's quarterfinals against Palisades Blue.

Playing in the consolation bracket, Kamali won both its matches, beating MVP Red, 16-12, 15-4, and FRVB Cone, 15-6, 15-10. Kamali advances to today's Round of 12.

Outrigger finishes fifth

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.—The Outrigger Canoe Club 17-and-under junior boys teams finished fifth at yesterday's U.S. Volleyball Junior Nationals.

No. 10 OCC upset No. 2 Palisades Blue, 15-4, 21-19, then lost to Evanston, Ill., 15-9, 16-14 to drop into the losers' bracket. OCC then lost to Malibu East, 15-11, 16-14.

Kamali Volleyball Club's boys 17-and-under team advanced to today's finals of the consolation bracket. Kamali beat Go Bears, 15-11, 15-13, then topped Moraga, 15-8, 15-19. The team will finish 13th, 14th or 15th, depending on today's outcome.

Outrigger outraces everybody

Rules Waikiki's waves with 112-point performance

It's summertime, and the winning is easy for the Outrigger Canoe Club.

Host Outrigger proved as much yesterday, easily claiming the 45th Walter J. Macfarlane Canoe Regatta off Waikiki Beach.

Outrigger scored points in all 30 events it entered and finished with a whopping 112 points — a total as rare in canoe racing as it is in high school basketball.

Hui Nalu finished second with 59 points and Kailua third with 45.

Outrigger's victory was its fifth as many Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association regattas this season. This title, however, came on what usually is considered the most glamorous and demanding course on the circuit.

The course, which runs at a 45-degree angle across the surf, puts paddlers at the mercy of nature. And Outrigger figured to have trouble after drawing the two most difficult lanes — Nos. 6 and 7, which run closest to the shore — in 11 races.

"If there is any surf at all, you're at a disadvantage racing in lanes down here," said Outrigger coach Michele St. John, pointing to lanes No. 6 and 7.

Said Outrigger's Walter Guild: "It appeared at the lane drawing we'd be in a lot of trouble. That made us a little bit concerned."

But their fears were not realized yesterday as everything, it seemed, went Outrigger's way.

Consider this:

- For most of the day, the surf was baby-skin smooth, negating any advantage the outside lanes might have offered.
- "Usually when the surf's really big, the lane you have is

what counts," Kailua's Rob Cates said. "When it's flat like this, anybody can win."

Said St. John: "The lanes were as even as I've ever seen them in the 14 years I've been involved in paddling. Course-wise, this is one of the fairest races I've ever seen."

• And the one time the surf played a factor — the men's senior race — it was Outrigger that benefited.

Outrigger and Kailua paddled bow to bow for most of the men's 2½-mile senior race, considered to be the blue-ribbon event of the regatta.

Then, with 200 yards to go, both crews tried to gain a push from a small wave. Kailua mistimed the wave, and fell about half the length of a boat behind Outrigger.

Outrigger caught the next small wave — "It was so small, I wouldn't even call it a wave," stroker Chris Kincaid said — and took a 1½-length lead and paddled to victory.

"It's just a lucky thing," Kincaid said. "They could have been just a little bit ahead of us and gotten a wave in their lane and gone ahead of us. At the end, it was whoever got lucky, and we got lucky."

Said Cates: "That's the ocean, I guess."

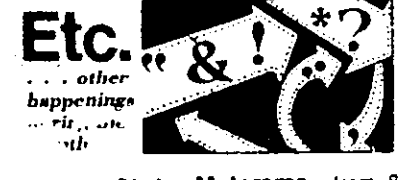
The outcome in the men's senior race was particularly gratifying for Outrigger, which lost to Kailua last year in the event. The names of the winning paddlers are inscribed on a silver trophy, which is kept at the Outrigger Canoe Club.

"Any senior crew from Outrigger that loses this race ... well, it's a big burden to carry," Kincaid said. "If you don't win, in a sense, you let down the club, even if the club may win the whole regatta."

Said Guild, a distant relative of Macfarlane: "There's a big hole when you don't win that

race. You have to wait a whole year to get another shot at it. We know. We walk past that trophy every day. We talked about it a lot. This was definitely one of our goals."
