# Hui Nalu crew looks to Molokai

Hui Nalu Canoe Club's wahine sophomore/senior crew are looking beyond this summer's Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing series of weekly regattas. They are in

search of greater challenges. The upset winners of both OHCRA races yesterday at Kailua Beach say those wins are nice but that their real goal is to win the Molokai-to-Oahu women's race this fall, something no Hawaii crew has been able to do in three

"This crew has great Molokai potential," said Hui Nalu steersperson Denise Darval of her

With more than 20 Molokai canoe and kayak races among them. the crew agrees that they have a shot at winning.

"Today's effort proved we can paddle fast beating some pretty good crews," said stroker Lesline Conner, a veteran of eight channel crossings, five in canoes and three in kayaks.

Lorey Bode, Lou Jane Lee, Anne Malama, Jenny Scafe, Darval and Conner made up Hui-Nalu's winning sophomore team. The same paddlers, except for Darval's sister Diane who replaced Lee, won the senior race. Favorite Healani Canoe Club placed a distant second in each of the two

For the second consecutive week, Kailua Canoe Club won OHCRA's "AA" team honors, yesterday, over Hui Nalu 91-72. "Outrigger has dominated local paddling for years. Now it's Kailua's turn as a dynasty," Kaneohe pad-

dler Jerry Rodrigues said. Kailua, Oahu's largest club with more than 200 paddlers, won 11 of the 30 heats and placed second in 10 others. Runnerup Hui Nalu, meanwhile, won eight and took

four seconds "We're not about to get cocky about our successes," Kailua coach Harrison "Beanie" Heen said. "Outrigger has a history of peaking toward the end of the season. The bottom line is to win the state

championship in August." Five-time defending state champ Outrigger finished a distant third with 53 points.

Surf Sports topped OHCRA's small clubs for the second straight. week. The 11-club Kamehameha: Day fleet was buffeted by strong winds and choppy seas.

Even Hui Nalu's coach Darryl Hara was surprised by his wahine paddlers. "A gift from heaven," he said, explaining how a winning crew gives a club a kick-start and momentum.

Paddlers switch clubs more often then major league baseball. players. "The four of us changed because we wanted to compete in the same crew. Hui Nalu gave us that opportunity," Malama said. Bode, Conner, Malama and Scafe paddled for Healani last season.

"I've really made the circuit," Conner admitted, recalling that six years ago she paddled on Hui Nalu's winning Molokai-Oahu crew, and the following year, in 1984, she was a member of Outrigger's first place Molokai crew. Prior to Healani, Bode, Malama and Scafe raced for Kailua.
