## Fifth Consecutive Regatta Title Won by a Whopping 42 Points

Outrigger Canoe Club won yes-terday's Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta off Waikiki Beach by scoring 104 points—a whopping 42 more than second-place Kai-

lua Canoe Club. So what's new? The undefeated OCC paddlers have now won five consecutive Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association regattas this season each by more than 100 points.

Of yesterday's 30 events, OCC won 17, placed second in another and took third in seven. So OCC is on a roll. In its own Macfarlane meet, OCC has won

nine of the last 12 regattas. Break up OCC? "Around the club they joke about it," OCC's head coach Henry Ayau said. Ayau explained that OCC's success comes with hard work, serious training and its ability to field a near-maximum number

ADDED OCC steersman Fred Hemmings, "It's not Outrigger's fault (the domination of the Whi sport). Something's wrong with the local paddling structure." Hemmings says that there are too many races and too many clubs.

OCC won both yesterday's blue ribbon events—the men's and women's senior races by wide margins. "In surf regattas such as this," OCC steersman Brant Ackerman remarked, "the luck of finding and then surfing waves plays a big part".

Some OCC opponents believe Outrigger has had more than its share of lucky waves this season. Kailua, this season's perennial OHCRA runnerup, is not discouraged. "The whole idea of any

Kailua paddler Bob Cates said. He added that winning is what Kailua hopes to do very soon.

CATES SAID that OCC has built a strong program. "I don't begrudge them anything," he said, adding that OCC's success just makes Kailua paddlers try that much harder. Cates reluctantly admits that its going to take some awful good paddling to top OCC this season

Cates, a former OHCRA officer, saw club profliferation problems on the horizon years ago. "I've always advocated closing off new clubs coming in," he said. Cates explained that OHCRA is an association where half the clubs enter only half the regatta's 30 events. "How can clubs expect to score points that way?" he asked.

MOST COACHES complained about the paddler shortage, especially among the younger crews. OCC, Kailua and Hui Nalu, yesterday's leading scorers, are OH-CRA's largest and strongest

While OCC fielded the regatta high, 28 of 30 possible crews, yesterday, some clubs could muster only a few teams. "The Association must be strengthened Cates added. Small OHCRA clubs, plus the many clubs of the Hui Wa'a Association have contributed to Oahu's paddling demise.

OF YESTERDAY'S 14 clubs, 10 competed in OHCRA's small-club "A" division. "We're hurting for paddlers," Hui Lanakila's president Gary Loo said.

Loo explained that Lanakila will compete in "A" but that its crews will set their sights on Outrigger. "Beating them is our goal," he said. Lanakila won vescompetition is to win," long-time terday's "A" division.
