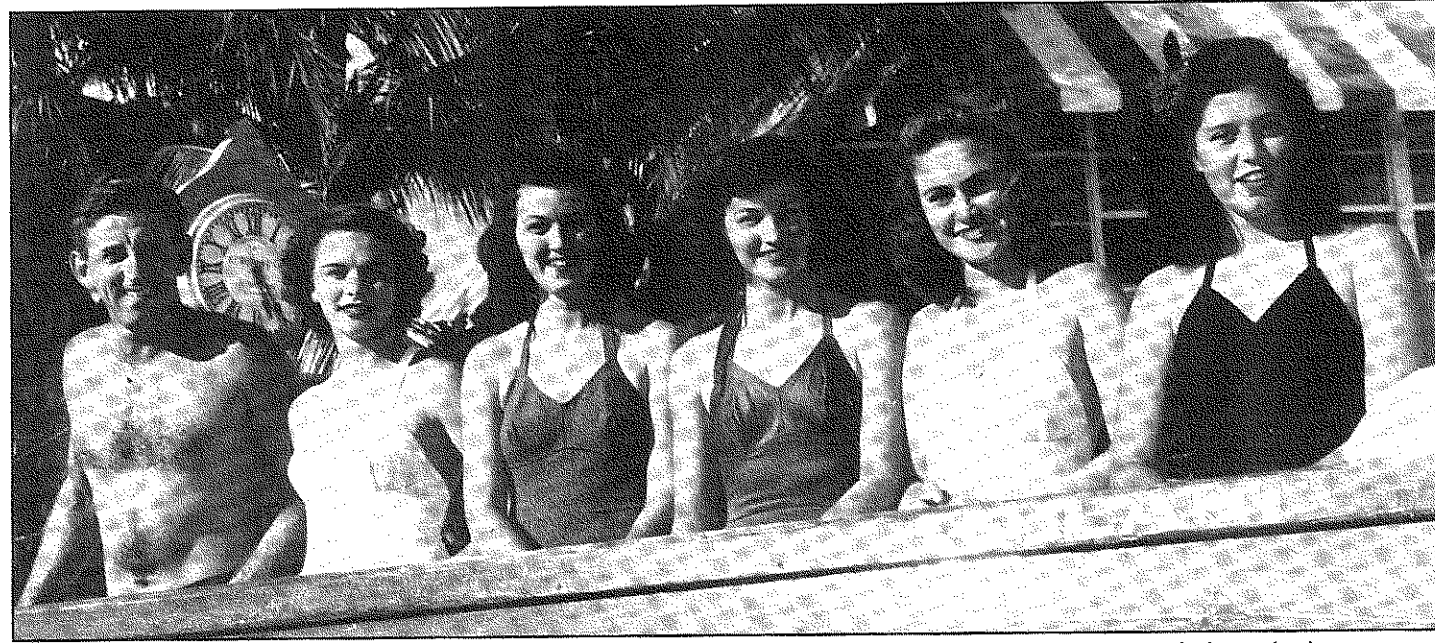


Macfarlane Regatta is 4th of July Tradition at Outrigger

It was 1943—the war was still going on in the Pacific and Europe. In Hawaii there was a light off-shore breeze at Waikiki Beach. It was glassy, with small groups of surfers.

The barbed wire was up on the beach in front of the Royal Hawaiian Hotel and the Moana. The inaugural 4th of July Macfarlane Regatta was getting underway.

The 48th annual Walter J. Macfarlane is again scheduled for the 4th of July. It is the only wave race in the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association schedule and commemorates Walter James "Mac" Macfarlane, president of the Outrigger Canoe Club at the time of his death in 1943.

At that time, the OCC sponsored a race on the 4th of July. Following Macfarlane's death, Henry DeGorog, manager of OCC suggested that this picturesque canoe activity be dedicated to Walter Mac and be known thereafter as the Walter J. Macfarlane Memorial Canoe Race.

The original race featured 13 events with the premiere event of the regatta, as always, the Senior Men's race. The early course was 4 1/2 miles and OCC dominated at this distance.

The first winning crew was Thad Ekstrand, John Beaumont, Tom Arnott, Jim Fernie, Bob Bush and steersman Duke Kahanamoku.

The Senior Men's perpetual trophy, a

Silver Bowl, was donated by the Royal Hawaiian Hotel's division of Matson Navigation Company in memory of Walter Mac.

The winning club Koa Wave Trophy was donated by Macfarlane's sister, Muriel Flanders in 1972.

This year promises spectacular weather, blue skies, the thrill of big waves, packed beaches and exciting unpredictable events. Don't miss it. Races get underway at 8:30 a.m.

OCC wins Kamehameha Day Regatta

Despite strong winds, Outrigger won its second straight OHCRA regatta, June 10, at Kailua Beach. OCC scored 75 points to runnerup Kailua's 67. Hui Nalu and Healani tied for third with 33 points each.

Club crews won nine events in the Kamehameha Day Regatta, finished second in four events, third in six and fourth in three.

Undefeated after the first two regattas are the Girls 12s, 16s and 18s, sophomore men, senior women and senior masters women.

The Senior Masters Women have won 14 straight regattas over the past three years.

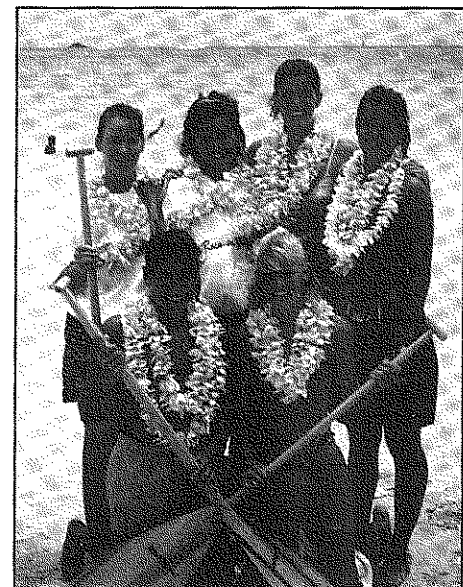
The Girls 18s have won nine of their last 10 races over the past two years, including Oahus and States last year.

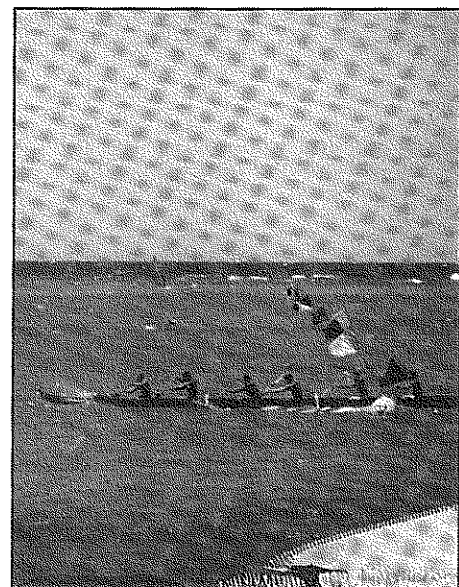

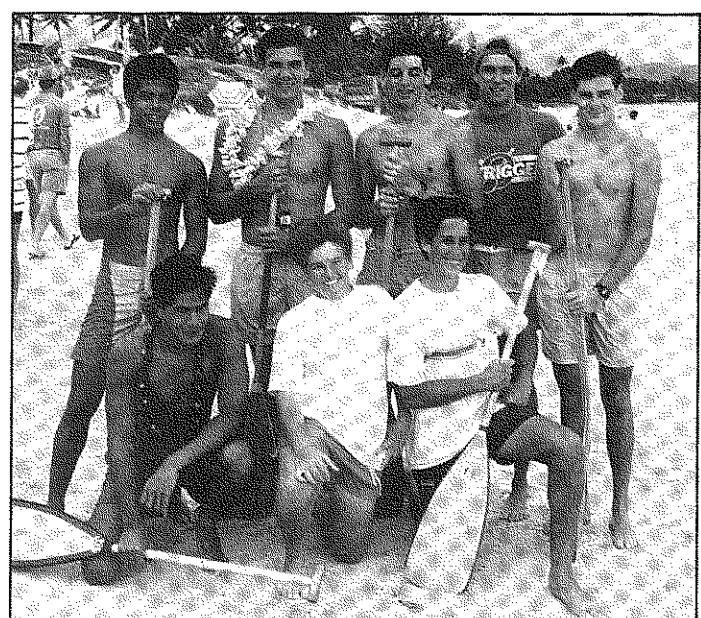

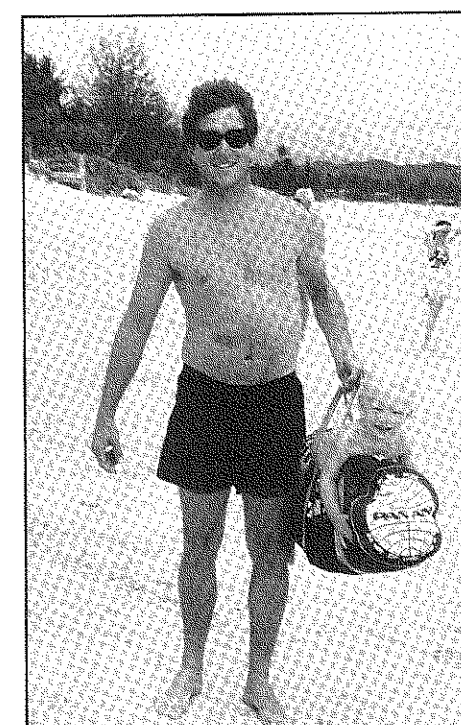

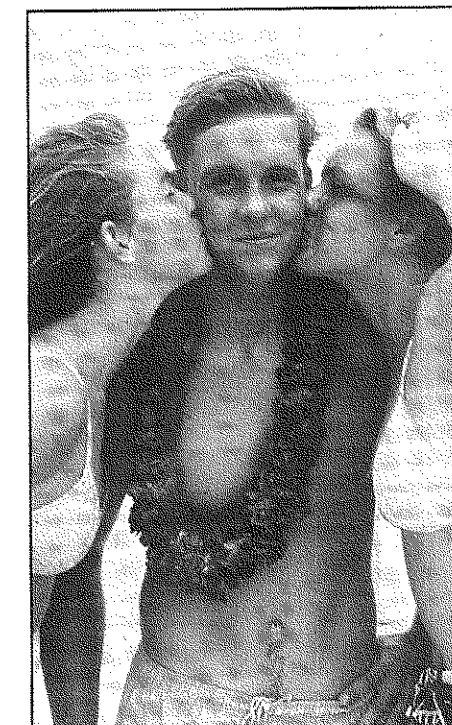

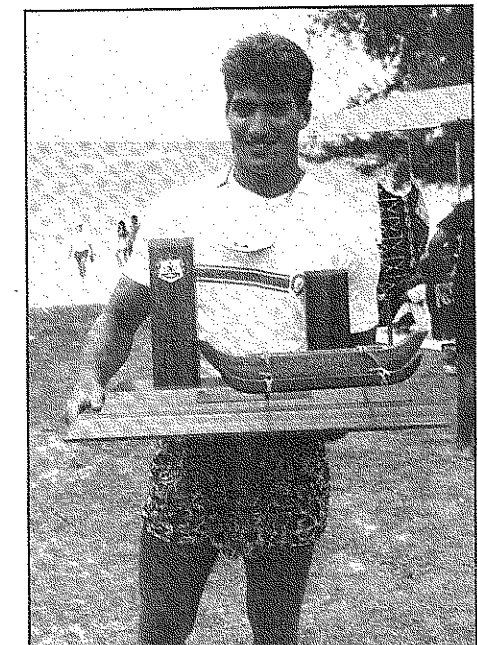

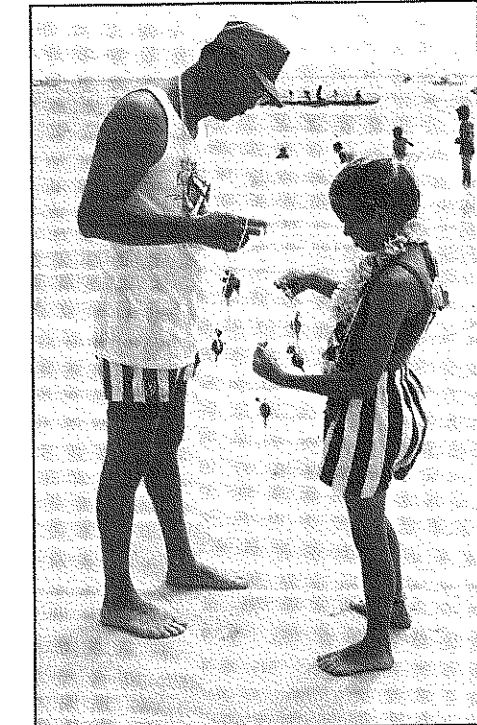
John Bulkley had a unique way to carry son, Matt, down Kailua Beach.
