Outrigger favored in Macfarlane canoe regatta

Unbeaten Outrigger is favored to stay that way today in the 48th annual Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta at Waikiki Beach.

More than 1,200 paddlers from 15 Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association clubs will participate in the competition, which starts at 8:30 a.m. in front of the Moana Hotel.

Host OCC, unbeaten in the first four regattas of the year, has won six consecutive Macfarlane regattas and 13 of the last 16.

Competition will be held in 31 events.

The regatta is named after Walter J. Macfarlane, president of Outrigger Canoe Club at the time of his death in 1943.

UH football ranked: Athlon's Western Football, a national football publication, has ranked the University of Hawaii 25th.

The magazine also predicts Brigham Young, which it ranks

21st, to win the Western Athletic Conference, edging the Rainbows. Florida State is named to win the national championship.

Vierra gets OK to enter sumo: Wayne Vierra, a former high school wrestling and judo champion from Kahuku High School, passed the initial physical examination yesterday to enter Japan's traditional sumo wrestling, the Sumo Association said.

The association said Vierra will make his debut Tuesday, the third day of the 15-day Nagoya Grand Sumo Tournament in central Japan.

Vierra, whose sumo ring name is Kamikiiwa, will be the 22nd non-Japanese among about 800 sumo wrestlers.

He will be the fourth American in the training stable of former sekiwake (junior champion) Jesse Kuhaulua, a Hawaii native.

In a telephone interview, the

288-pound Vierra said, "I want to be like Akebono (Chad Rowan from Hawaii), Chiyonofuji (a grand champion) and Jesse."

Meanwhile, he said, "I must learn to speak Japanese."

Pro Bowl ticket sale: Ticket statements for the 1991 AFC-NFC Pro Bowl game, to be played Feb. 3 at Aloha Stadium, will be mailed Aug. 15. Payment is due Sept. 15.

Prices will be \$21 (loge level), \$18 (all other sideline seats) and \$15 (end zone). High school students and children

can buy north end zone tickets for \$8.

Pro-Am tees off: Mauna Kea Beach Hotel's 17th annual Pro-Am Golf Tournament will start today at the Robert Trent Jones-designed golf course. The three-day 54-hole event ends Friday.

Defending champion is Arne Dokke of San Juan Hills Golf Course, a three-time winner of this event in the professional division. He also won in 1986 and 1988.

The field of 32 professionals includes host pro J.D. Ebersberger, Richard Martinez and Greg Nichols of the Aloha Section. Southern California pros Mike Reehl and Bob Husband

and Arizona pros Sam Ainslee and Mike Abbott are other contenders.

The pros are competing for \$12,000 and amateurs for \$15,000 in merchandise prizes.

Ebersberger said the pro-am kicks off a month-long celebration of Mauna Kea Beach Hotel's 25th anniversary.

New Waikeke coach: Wayne Yamauchi, physical education teacher at Waikeke High School, has been appointed the Warriors' golf coach, succeeding Riki Mori, who retired in May after winning his fifth state team championship.

In another announcement, Waikeke athletic director Ken Yamase said Alvin Abruman

will succeed Howard Shindo as coach of the Waikeke High girls' bowling team that finished second both in the state and the league last year.

Bodysurfing in Ocean-side: The 14th annual World Bodysurfing Championships are scheduled Aug. 17-19 in Ocean-side, Calif. Entry deadline is Aug. 3.

This year the competition will add a Grand Masters division for those 65 and older. Anyone 12 or older can enter. The fee is \$12.

Outrigger dominates despite upset

Lanikai Canoe Club's camp exploded off the beach like fireworks on the Fourth of July after its senior men upset Outrigger Canoe Club in yesterday's 48th Walter J. Macfarlane Memorial Regatta at Waikiki.

And hearing the loud whoops and hollers one would think upstart Lanikai knocked off its unbeaten rival for the regatta title instead of just one important race.

"Give us a break," Lanikai steersman Jim Foti remarked. "This is the 48th year the Macfarlane has been held here and it's Lanikai's first senior men's win."

"Never before have we had the pleasure of drinking champagne from the silver bowl that goes with winning. It's going to have a nice taste."

The spirited Lanikai crew, consisting of Charles Cates, Paul Graham, Kalani Irvine, Mike Smith, and brothers John and Jim Foti, battled favored Outrigger over the entire 2 1/2 miles.

"Our move came during the second mile. We caught a wave and slowly edged away. My biggest win

ever, for sure," said the happy Jim Foti, who steered a number of the club's other crews on the day where open steering was allowed.

Lanikai's seniors turned the looping out-and-back course in 18 minutes and 10 seconds, beating defending champ Outrigger by 31 seconds.

Despite paddling its best regatta of the season, perhaps in years, Lanikai proved no match for Outrigger when it came to team scoring and crew depth. Outrigger qualified for all 30 events while Kailua and Hui Nalu each had 26 crews, Healani 20 and Lanikai 18.

"We're just a little residential club (100 paddlers) that's happy paddling among Oahu's major powers (Outrigger, Kailua, Healani and Hui Nalu)," Lanikai coach Bobby Puakea said.

Outrigger, winner of the past six Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association championships and five consecutive Oahu HCRA regattas this season, scored a whopping 95 points in its easy AA division win yesterday.

Its crews won 13 of Macfarlane's 30 races and were runner-up in seven other events. With approximately 200 paddlers, Outrigger has

more depth than any club in the state.

Kailua placed a distant second with 49 points, followed closely by Lanikai with 43. Hui Nalu came in fourth with 35 points and Healani placed fifth with 25.

Waikiki Surf Club, with exceptional steering by former Outrigger paddlers, brothers Kainoa and Keone Downing, topped the smaller "A" division with 15 points.

The Macfarlane Regatta, held in surf off tourist-packed Waikiki Beach, is designated by the OHCRA as an open steering event. This gives men, supposedly stronger and more skilled in handling waves, clearance to steer any crew. It's a rule usually taken advantage of in the novice, kids and women's races.

"Perhaps men do have more paddling strength, but women can hold their own steering," said Outrigger's Liz Perry-Duggan, one of few women skippers yesterday who chose not to relinquish her steering position to a man. The Perry-Duggan led mixed crew won its half-mile race by four seconds over Waikiki Surf Club, also steered by a woman, Kuumea Gora.
