in shallow water, where you have to paddle over slow, heavy water. That's why you'll see some paddling toward the middle.

"There's a lot of strategy. You'll see the steersmen in the open events reading the water all the way in and out and weaving through the water."

Guild's senior men's crew was second to Lanikai yesterday, but he was part of Outrigger's winning mixed crew.

He steered two winners, the 18 girls and the sophomore women.

Outrigger played spoiler for three previously unbeaten crews. Makaha's boys 13's, Kailua's women novice A's and Healani's sophomore women were all knocked off for the first time this year.

Only two of Outrigger's four previously unbeaten crews left Waikiki unscathed. The 16 girls and senior master women won, while Lanikai's sophomore men and Kailua's senior women both beat Outrigger's entries.

Gerald Coron aided suffering, helpless in isles and abroad

Gerald G. "Jerry" Coron started nurturing people early in his life, said a sister, Bertha Coron.

"He was always looking out for people," she said.

Coron, former manager of the Hawaii Chapter of the American Red Cross, with service in that agency in many other capacities domestically and abroad, died Monday in Queen's Hospital at the age of 69.



Gerald Coron hell of a nice kid, very loving. He used to look out for me and my two sisters, and then go home and fight with us," she said. "We fought a lot and loved a lot."

"I always felt everything would be OK when I talked to Jerry. Now all of a sudden, he's not here, and it's not OK."

Coron's sister said her brother made one stab at making money by trying to sell insurance out of a brother's office.

The first day, he came back from his prospect saying the day had cost him \$20 because the man didn't even have money for his children's food, Bertha Coron said.

Coron was born in Manhattan in New York City, but spent his childhood in Canton, Ohio.

He earned a bachelor of science degree at Ohio State University and a master's degree from the University of Southern California.

Before and after serving in the Army in Europe during World War II, he was a Red Cross volunteer in safety services.

In 1948, Coron joined the Red Cross career staff as director of first aid and water safety for Richland County Chapter in Mansfield, Ohio.

During his career, he was a leader in a variety of operations in the wake of war and natural devastation.

Coron oversaw the United Nations exchange of prisoners of the Korean War. He helped Hungarian refugees and 150,000 evacuees to the United States from Indo-China. He led disaster relief efforts in East Pakistan.

As a representative of the League of Red Cross Societies and the International Committee of the Red Cross, he helped organize the Liberian National Red Cross and East Pakistan Red Cross Society, and aided the South Pacific region of the League of Red Cross Societies.

He was on the faculty of the Disaster Training Institute in Jakarta, Indonesia, and taught disaster preparedness in many areas around the world.

He was manager of the Hawaii Chapter of the American Red Cross in 1963.

Also in Hawaii, Coron was a director of Hawaiian Mortuaries Ltd., a trustee of Hawaiian Memorial Park Cemetery Association; and executive committee chairman of the Hawaiian Memorial Park Cemetery Association.

He was a former member of the Governor's Veterans Employment Advisory Council.

Coron was a founder of the Deputies, a support group of the Honolulu Police and Fire departments.

He was president of the Henri Dunant Institute, which provides support to developing Red Cross Societies in the Pacific.

He also is survived by two brothers, Howard and Richard; and two other sisters, June Shelton and Dorothy Stearn.

Memorial services will be at 9:30 a.m. Monday at the Outrigger Canoe Club.

In lieu of flowers, the family suggests memorial donations to the Deputies Scholarship Fund, in care of P.O. Box 27084, Honolulu 96827.

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Robert I. Bush, resorts planner

Robert Innes Bush, who advocated careful planning for Hawaii's growing tourism industry and stressed preserving its natural beauty, died June 26, 1990, at the age of 70 in San Diego.

Born in Paia, Maui, he retired, privately employed planner of resorts and residential developments graduated from Roosevelt High School and attended the University of Hawaii.

He and his wife Jeanne had lived in Carlsbad, Calif., since 1987.

Bush, who was president of the Hawaii Chapter of the American Institute of Planners during the late 1960s, often spoke of planning for Hawaii's future.

He strongly supported the H-3 freeway in order to relieve the burden on the Likie and Pali highways and stressed the need for new tourism goals to reflect conditions of the times.

Bush was a member of the Outrigger Canoe Club for 57 years and, as a teen-ager, paddled canoes with Duke Kahanamoku.

In addition to his wife, Bush is survived by a brother, Stephen, of Vacaville, Calif.; cousins Mrs. Nicholas (Patty) Deter, Mrs. Wayne (Carroll) Richardson, G. Fred Bush III; and numerous other cousins, nieces and nephews on the Mainland.

His ashes will be scattered off Waikiki on Aug. 24 on what would have been Kahanamoku's 100th birthday. Donations in his memory may be made to the Duke Kahanamoku Foundation c/o of the Outrigger Canoe Club, 2909 Kalakaua Ave., Honolulu 96815.
