Gerald Coron, 69 ex-Red Cross chief

Gerald "Jerry" Coron of Honolulu, who directed the Red Cross' 1975 "Operation New Life" to assist 150,000 refugees fleeing from Vietnam, died July 9, 1990, at The Queen's Medical Center. He was 69.

Coron was born in New York City and was raised in Canton, Ohio.

He received his bachelor of science degree from Ohio State University and a master's degree from the University of Southern California, and went on to serve in the U.S. Army in Europe in World War II.

He worked for seven years as a Red Cross volunteer before joining the organization as a paid staff member in 1948.

He later served on special assignment with the joint Red Cross team overseeing the United Nations' exchange of prisoners during the Korean War, and, in 1960, helped organize the Liberian National Red Cross Society.

In 1963, he was assigned as manager of the Hawaii state chapter and in 1971 was named manager of the Red Cross' Pacific Division including Hawaii, Wake Island, Guam, American Samoa and the U.S. territories

and trust possessions in the Pacific.

Alaska and the Northern Marianas were later placed under his jurisdiction.

He retired several years ago. Coron was a director of Hawaii Mortuaries Ltd., founding member of the Deputies support group for the Honolulu Police Department, a member of the Outrigger Canoe Club and president and co-founder of the Henri Dunant Institute to help developing Red Cross societies in the Pacific.

He is survived by brothers, Howard and Richard; sisters, June Shelton, Dorothy Stearn and Bertha Coron; and nieces and nephews.

■ **Bill Burrud**, the child actor who grew up to produce and host "Animal World" and other popular television travel, adventure and animal programs,

has died at age 65. Burrud died unexpectedly Thursday night at his Huntington Beach home, 26 miles south of Los Angeles, after a heart attack. Earlier Thursday he was in the offices of his Bill Burrud Productions there, working on a one-hour special for Disney's cable Discovery Channel called "Sea Mammals." He made his stage debut at the age of 7 in the road show "Music in the Air" and acted in 28 movies, ranging from "The Cowboy and the Kid" to "Captains Courageous."

■ **Amos Neyhart**, the man who taught the first-ever driver education class in the country, has died of a stroke at age 91 in State College, Pa. Neyhart died July 5, but his death wasn't made public until this week. Neyhart worked for five years in a silk mill. He later became an assistant professor at Penn State and earned a master's degree in psychology.

Neyhart's role as "Mr. Safety" began in 1931 when a drunken driver hit his parked car, convincing him that teenagers needed to learn the best way to drive. He used his own 1929 Graham-Paige automobile to teach volunteer students from State College High School as he put together his ideas.

He set up the first formal course in 1933 and went on to present the first teacher preparation course in driver education and the first seminar in that field for college professors.

Near-perfect finish for Lokahi Outrigger paddles to ninth OH CRA regatta title in row

With the Hui Wa'a Championships next Saturday, the Lokahi Canoe Club warmed up with an easy victory in the AA Division at the 12th Waikiki Beach Boys Invitational Regatta yesterday at Waikiki Beach.

Lokahi finished an undefeated regular season by scoring 66 points to second-place Ka Mo'i's 41. Manu O Ke Kai was third with 40.

The only blemish on Lokahi's season to date is a tie with Ka Mo'i in the July 1 regatta at Kahana Bay.

The AA Division is for clubs with 15 or more crews.

Lokahi won seven of eight men's events, the only loss coming to the Waikiki Yacht Club in the Novice B race.
