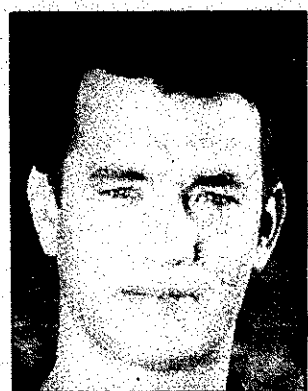

Plowing through swells of an estimated 10 feet, Outrigger Canoe Club won the 22nd Duke Kahanamoku men's long distance canoe race. The winning nine-man crew was timed in a non-record 3 hours, 57 minutes, 93 seconds on the 22-mile course from Magic Island to Kailua Beach.

Six of the 21 crews did not finish the race, including host Lanikai, which saw its koa canoe *Ho'ala* destroyed after going down off Makapuu Point.

For the second year in a row, rough conditions forced a change in the women's race. And for the second week in a row, Hui Nalu edged out Healan for first place. Again crossing first in its koa canoe, Hui Nalu finished the six-mile course from Kailua Beach to Smith's Point in Lanikai and back in 42 minutes, 48 seconds.
