## Hoomanao paddling event

The Hoomanao Challenge '89, a 75-mile, six-man outrigger sailing canoe race from Kaaanapali, Maui to Waikiki, Oahu, will be held Sunday, May 28 beginning at 5:30 a.m.

The purpose of the race is to revive the ancient tradition of outrigger sailing canoes, by which islanders travelled. The name "Hoomanao" means to remember, or bring back.

The entry fee is \$250 per boat, with 100 percent of the fee given to Winner's Camp, a non-profit special youth education program. There is a \$13,400 total cash purse, with first-place receiving \$5,000.

Finishers through the seventh spot will receive cash prizes. The race is open to all participants interested in outrigger sailing canoe racing. Top contenders so far are Hanalei of Kauai, Outrigger of Oahu and the Maui Sailing Team.

## Interisland canoe race May 28

The Ho'omana'o Challenge, a 75 mile, six-man outrigger sailing canoe race from Kaaanapali, Maui to Waikiki Beach on Oahu, will be held May 28.

The entry fee is \$250 per boat. The race is a benefit providing scholarships to Winner's Camp, a non-profit special youth education program. Cash prizes of more than \$13,000 will be awarded, including \$5,000 for first place and \$3,000 for second.

The race is open to all participants interested in racing outrigger sailing canoes. Contenders entered include Kauai's Hanalei Canoe Club, Outrigger Canoe Club, the Maui Sailing team and the Island Tan team.

The first Ho'omana'o Challenge took place in 1987 from Pokai Bay, Oahu to Kalapaki Bay, Kauai. The race was organized to help revive the tradition of ancient Hawaiian outrigger sailing. Mike Muller is the race director, with Mike Tongg co-director.

## Haili tourney ends with sudden-death win by Short Sets

Action in the 31st Haili Men's Club Volleyball Tournament concluded yesterday at Afook-Chinen Civic Center and it came down to sudden death in the exciting Women's AA championship match.

Short Sets, a team featuring former University of Hawaii All-American Reydan "Tita" Ahuna, won the sudden death and championship with a 15-13 victory over Molten, which came up through the loser's bracket to take two sets over Short Sets, 15-3, 15-10, forcing the extra game.

Molten, comprised primarily of former University of Hawaii at Hilo, Brigham Young University-Hawaii and Hawaii Pacific College players, made the finals by defeating Spencer's 10-12, 15-3, 14-12. The Molten team included former Vulcan Flo Alo, an NAIA All-American.

Short Sets threatened to run away with the sudden-death game, jumping out to an 11-1 advantage, behind the hitting of Ahuna and middle blocker Jamie Long.

Molten came back to tie the score at 12, taking the opportunity to capitalize on a smaller Short Sets front row while Long was playing backcourt before

the favorites took the game and the match.

In the Men's AA finals, Outrigger Canoe Club defeated Lokahi 15-7, 9-11, 15-9. Lokahi beat Bucky's 15-8, 14-12 to reach the championship match.

Outrigger Masters won the Men's A title over Koolau Lager 15-2, 9-7. Koolau advanced to the finals by beating Maui Brothers 12-6, 8-15, 15-6.

Kamalii I took the Women's A finals over MacFarms 7-15, 16-14, 15-9. MacFarms set up the meeting by defeating Navy Hawaii 14-8, 15-9.

The Men's Masters title went to Windows, which outlasted Outrigger Gold 11-8, 15-11, 15-13. Outrigger Gold beat Hilo Yacht Club Red 13-9, 15-5 to advance to the finals.

Hilo's Haili Masters team won the Women's Masters championship. The Haili club downed the Superette Masters 15-10, 14-16, 13-4.

Kapena turned back Slamma Jammass 11-15, 15-11, 15-7 for the Women's B title. Slamma Jammass whipped Windward 13-11, 11-6 to make it to the title match.

Island Snow won the Men's B championship over Bad Sets 15-10, 15-10. Bad Sets advanced to the finals by beating Linzy's, a Hilo team, 13-15, 15-11, 15-7.

## OCC pockets AA crown Oahu powerhouse whips Lokahi in final

Outrigger Canoe Club, behind the play of Jimmy Kalaukoa, Marc Haine and Scott Rigg, fought off Lokahi 15-7, 9-11, 15-9 to capture the Men's AA championship Saturday in the 31st Haili Men's Club Volleyball Tournament.

Kalaukoa was named the division's most outstanding player. Player-coach Pedro Velasco of Lokahi was named most valuable player. They were joined on the all-tournament team by OCC's Haine and Rigg, Lokahi's Rollie and Phillip Velasco and Bucky's Aukai Gonsalves.

The week-long tournament, under the organization of the Haili club and the Lindsey family of Hilo, attracted 126 teams in four different men's and women's divisions. It was played at five sites over the week with Saturday's semifinal and final matches at Afook-Chinen Civic Auditorium and UHH Gym.

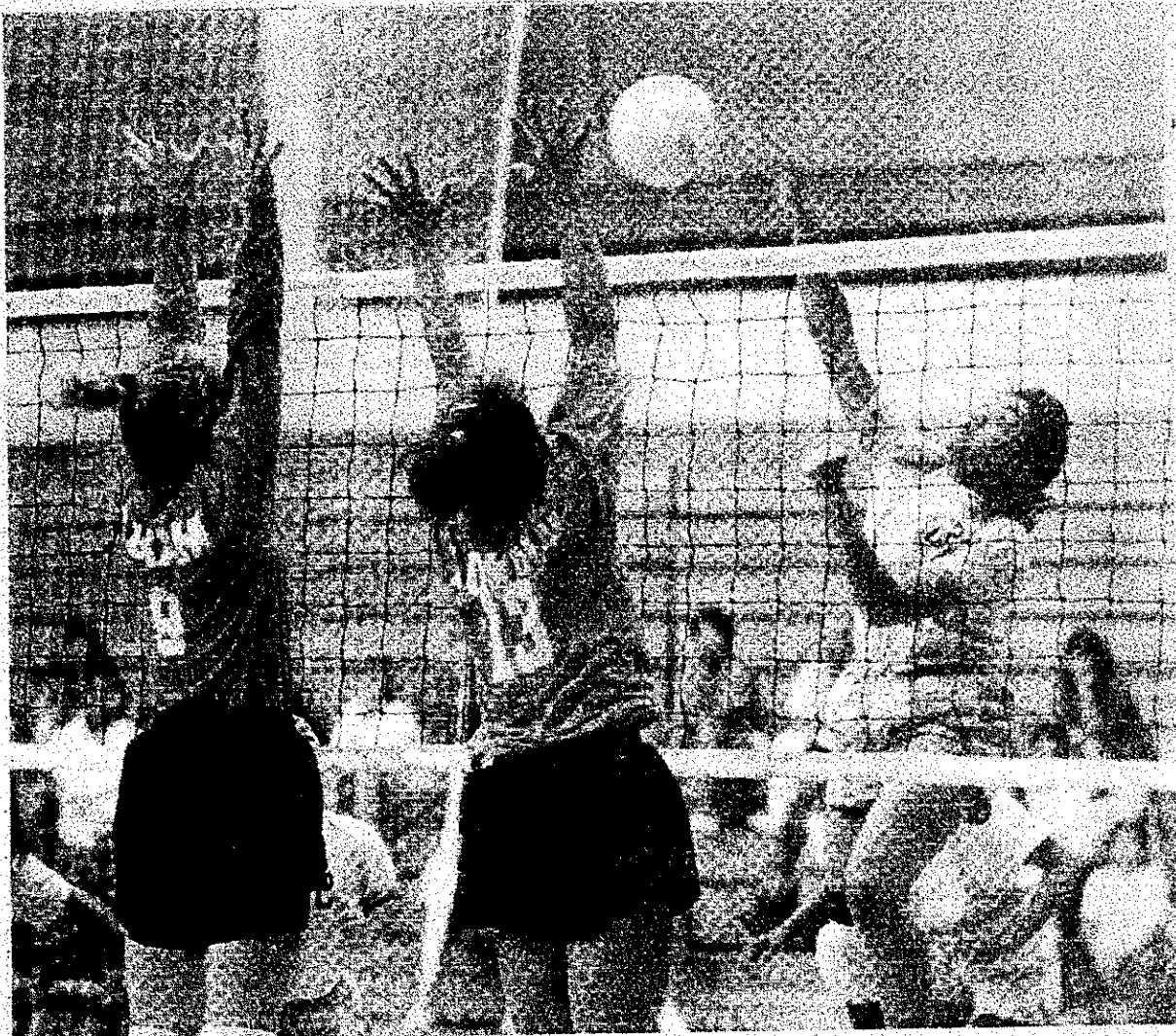
**Men's A Stars**
