Outpoints field to bring home another state championship

HANALEI, Kauai - The state canoe championship will rest comfortably with the Outrigger Canoe Club.

Again.

For the second consecutive year and the 10th time in the last 11 years, Outrigger won the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association State Championship Regatta. At Hanalei Bay yesterday, Outrigger amassed 140 points to out-distance the rest of the competition.

"It's a great victory," said Outrigger's first-year head coach Kalani Schrader. "Definitely rewarding. Not only for me, but for the whole club as


