Circuit tennis has final four

KONA — Xochitl Escobedo and Claudia Hernandez, both of Mexico, won their way into the singles semifinals of the \$10,000 U.S. Tennis Association Women's Circuit and Challenger Series yesterday at the Keauhou Beach Hotel tennis courts.

Vanne Akagi, who was the only Hawaii player remaining in the tournament, lost her doubles match yesterday and is out of contention.

Escobedo needed three sets to defeat Elizabeth Galphin, 7-5, 4-6, 6-0. Escobedo will play third-seeded Shandra Livingston in today's second semifinal. Livingston downed Helle Viragoh yesterday, 6-1, 6-2.

Hernandez, a 7-6 (7-5), 6-3 winner over Holly Lloyd, will play Heather Crowe in today's first semifinal at 9 a.m. Crowe downed Vincenza Procacci, 6-4, 6-1.

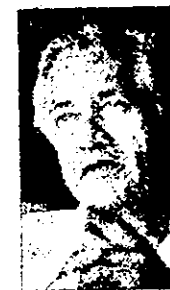

BERKELEY, Calif. — Despite the absence of their most famous player, television star and former All-American Tom Selleck, Honolulu's Compadres qualified for the semifinals of the U.S. Open Volleyball Championship in the Men's Senior Division.

The Compadres made it this far by winning three games yesterday, including a wild one over last year's champion, arch-rival **Outrigger Canoe Club** of Honolulu 9-15, 15-1 and 13-9.

Outrigger had lost to Billauer Chiropractic of Los Angeles and beat Denver's Lehman, Lucchesi, and Walker before being eliminated by Compadres.

Also in the Men's Senior Division, Hilo's Brilhante Real Estate qualified for the final in the consolation round by eliminating California's Try Weekly.

In other Hawaiian team action: Men's Club teams Outrigger and Hawaiian Surf both lost yesterday. Women's Club team J. Dominis won once and lost once, while Hawaiian Air won a consolation bracket game.
