

ALL-CHINESE LOSE TO OUTRIGGERS IN EXCITING BATTLE

Hilo Team Runs Up Eighteen Points to Twelve in Second Half but Unable to Overcome Lead

CHU AND SWAN MAKE BRILLIANT SHOWING

High School Freshmen Defeat St. Mary's School by Narrow Margin of One Point; Tonight's Schedule

By a final score of 35 to 31 the Honolulu Outriggers at the Armory last night defeated the All Chinese basket ball team in a game which, with the exception of one or two disagreeable features, was a hard-fought battle and an interesting exposition of the lively game of ball-tossing. It was a closely contested battle throughout and, although the Chinese players ran up 18 points in the second half to their opponents' 12, they could not overcome the standing of 23 to 13 gained by the visitors in the first period.

C. Chu, of the Chinese quintet, played the stellar role as a basket slinger last night, according to the score sheet, he having made 20 points for his team out of the total 31. "Skeeter" Swan, of the surf riders, led the van for his husky aggregation, making 16 points for his team, 12 of which were laid in the net during the first half. Nolan came in for third money by scoring 13 points for his squad, 9 of which were made in the first half.

Like all hard fought battles, it took on the nature of a scrimmage at times, and Referee Carter was kept busy as a Swiss bell ringer watching the plays and tooting his shrill whistle. Both sides were out to win, and the Outriggers were especially determined to triumph, as a defeat last night would have darkened their record by losing at least two out of a possible three games. As it now stands, tonight's game will tell the tale, and Hilo's champs, the Boarding School Alumni, will be pitted against the hitherto invincible boys from the capital city. Whatever the outcome of tonight's game is, the Big City boys are going back home with a lot of respect for the basket ball ability of the Crescent City lads. They have had no walk-over thus far, and have the battle of their young lives ahead tonight.

The lineup of the Outriggers last night was: **Forwards, Nolan and Huffman;** center, Nottage; guards, Swan and Quinn, with Quick substituting.

For the All Chinese team, C. Chu and U. Chu were forwards, Lai Hip was at center, and Chock and Goo guarded, with Chang as a substitute guard.

The preliminary game of the double header last night was played between St. Mary's school team and the High School Freshmen team. It resulted in a victory for the Freshmen by the close score of 16 to 15. It was a clean game, well played, and neck and neck, as the score indicates. Each side scored 10 points in the second half.

The players on the Freshman team were: Vierra and Afook, forwards; L. Cook, center, and Bell and E. Cook, guards.

St. Mary's School lined up as follows: Kim Paker and W. Costa, forwards; Pau, center, and Watson and Momi, guards.

As a preliminary tonight, a cracker-jack team from Pasohau will meet the Lake Field team from Honolulu, the soldier boys being at present in camp at the Volcano and have the reputation of being fast, clean, sportsmanlike ball tossers.

After the basket ball teams retire tonight from the Armory floor, a dance will follow to the music of the Lake Field Jazz band, which rendered both vocal and instrumental selections last night during the intermissions.
