

# HUI MAKANI WANT MEET IN MAY WOULD HAVE WEISMULLER THEN WANT TO MATCH DUKE AND PUA

The Hui Makani has applied to the Hawaiian A. A. U. for permission to hold a tank meet late in the month of May, at which the club hopes to have John Weismuller, famous Illinois Athletic club swimmer, compete over the 50 and 100 yards against Duke and Pua Kealoha.

The club would stage the meet in the new Punahou tank, and also wants to hold the 50 yards men's senior indoor national championship, an event awarded to the Hawaiian A. A. U. at the last national A. A. U. meeting.

## GAME WARDEN AFTER SECRETARY DENBY

RICHMOND, Va., Jan. 9.—Secretary Denby was asked today in a formal inquiry from the state commissioner of game and fisheries to explain why he hunted recently in Virginia without a license. The Shriners were notified recently that owing to the feeling prevalent in local swimming circles against spending A. A. U. money for bringing swimmers here from the mainland, the Hawaiian A. A. U. could not bring Weismuller here for the June meet. The Shriners then notified the A. A. U. that they would bring Weismuller for the meet.

### For Tank Meet

Now the Hui Makani has come along with a proposition that Weismuller be brought here late in May and that he compete in a tank meet first with the understanding that if he wins in the tank, and he holds the world record for 100 yards in a tank, he will meet Duke and Pua in the 100 yards straightaway in open water in June.

Should the Hui Makani fail to get Weismuller for its May meet, it hopes to issue a challenge to Duke Kahanamoku to meet Pua Kealoha in the 50 yards men's senior indoor national championship and also in a special 100 yards indoor race, figuring that this would be a big drawing card.

### Looks Good

In the event that Weismuller can be brought for the May tank meet and held over for the June outdoor meet, the sprint championship of the world should be decided with the excellent probability that one or more new world records will be hung up.

Hawaii was awarded the 50 yards men's senior indoor national championship and the 100 yards men's senior outdoor national championship. The latter is the blue ribbon event of the swimming world. Weismuller holds the world's tank record for 100 yards at :52.2 made in November in the I. A. C. pool in Chicago. Duke and Pua are joint holders of the world outdoor record for 100 yards at :53 flat.
