

Notables Are To Take Part In Soccerite Annual Party

High officials of the Territory, the army, and all that will be much in evidence. The leading and lesser luminaries of the soccer world will be on hand, and a good time will be had by all.

The program, as arranged for the occasion by Jimmy Dunbar and the rest of the entertainment committee, will offer Wallace R. Farrington in the role of headline speaker. His excellency, the Governor, will make a special trip in from Schofield Barracks just to be with the boys for the evening.

Major Generals Summerall and Mencher will be present and will make short talks on the subject of athletics in the service generally and of soccer in particular.

By way of contrast Col. Maitland Wood will tell of the World War in Mesopotamia, he having served with Allenby in that area during the war.

Songs, dances, instrumental numbers and the presentation of medals to the championship team will be the remainder of the entertainment.

The service is contributing a goodly share of the entertainment for the evening. Private James Bishop will give some songs and do a few fancy steps as will Sergeant Scotty Dunn. Private Walter Wolf will do a ventriloquist's act that is said to be a knock-out. Private Art King will offer a tenor solo.

Sergeant F. Sylakowsker, reported to be the jazzin'est operator of the catch-as-catch-can saxophone on this island, will do his solo numbers for the edification of the audience. A quartet composed of King, Shewan, Beckman and Barrett will also appear. After this Private Shewan will sing a solo.

The dinner will start promptly at 7:00 o'clock. One hundred are expected to be present.

Competition No. 1

Competition No. 3

Penalty Kick at Disappearing Goal-keeper—Prize, Bronze—Limited to five players from each club.

Judges: James A. Dunbar and H. W. Hay.

Competition No. 4

Dribbling Contest—Prize, Bronze—Limited to five players from each club in five preliminary ties and final.

Judge: Robert Anderson.

Competition No. 5

Final Five-a-Side Tournament—7½-minute periods—Prize: Winner, Five Bronze Badges.
