

Pentathlon Title May Go To Honolulu

The annual pentathlon of the local Y. M. C. A. has shown and proved results that are superior to those of last year's events.

During the program of last year a total of 13,390 points was scored. The total this year registers 22,090, and still there are seven fellows to take part in the towing event, one in the 50-yard backstroke, two in the 50-foot underwater swim, and two in the 220-yard swim.

This should bring the total up to quite a figure and leads the "Y" coaches to believe that the Honolulu association will appear at the head of the list when the international committee makes a grand total of all the points that have been handed to them from the associations who took part.
