

Island Mark Shattered In Thurston Meet

Another island swimming record was broken on Tuesday evening when Lillie Bowmer, swimming in the Thurston meet at the Elizabeth P. Waterhouse memorial tank at Punahou, covered the 50 yards in 0:28.4. This mark also equals the world's record for that distance in a tank.

Another surprise was sprung when Helen Moses defeated Mariechen Wehselau in the 50-yard open. Her time was 0:29.3.

In the novice Betty Lindsay was first and Peggy Ault second. Eleanor Bickerton was an easy victor in the junior novice, winning from Constance Davis in 0:35 flat.

The defeat in the half-century worried Mariechen Wehselau and she set her jaws grimly when the starter got them ready for the 100 yards academy open. She defeated Helen Moses in this race and bettered her island record by covering the distance in 1:05.2. Her previous record was 1:06 flat, made at the "wahine" meet last month. In the century for academy novices, Betty Lindsay was first and Peggy Ault was second.

Lillie Bowmer took the century in the junior open, with Helen Sanborn second. Constance Davis was

Lillie Bowmer was first in the plunge for the junior open and Caroline Wilcox was second. In the junior novice Geraldine Bockus was first and Moku Gittel was second.

The 50 yards backstroke, diving and 220 yards free style event will be held today. Helen Moses with two first and the best chance in the diving and 220 yards stands a good chance to win the meet.
