

# PUA KEALOHA IS TO SWIM IN TANK MEET

Pua Kealoha, joint holder with Duke Kahanamoku of the world record for 100 yards open water, will swim in the Hui Makani meet at Punahou tank this week. The meet is scheduled for Friday and Saturday night.

Pua will be a member of the St. Louis college team in the school relay race. The entry lists for the meet closed Saturday with a total of 75 swimmers entered and among the names of those to swim was that of Pua Kealoha.

It was announced some time ago that Pua would not swim. Pua was a member of the Hui Makani, but resigned from the club some time ago for various reasons. But when St. Louis college decided to enter a team in the relay race, Pua agreed to swim and will probably be anchor man for the outfit. The Saints relay team won the relay race in the Interscholastic meet.

Tickets for the Hui Makani meet are already on sale at Benson, Smith & Co., and are reported to be selling like the well known "hot cakes"

The officials and members of the committee in charge of the Hui Makani tank races are meeting today at noon to discuss details in connection with the meet.
