

ISLAND RECORDS PUT IN SHADE YESTERDAY

While the times made in the second half of the Thurston swimming meet at Punahou tank yesterday will not go down as official records because of too few timers, they will be marked as noteworthy performances. Lillie Bowmer came close to the world record of :35.3 held by Sybil Bauer for the 50 yards backstroke by covering the distance yesterday in :36.8 and bettering the island record. Mariechen Wehselau beat her own time for the 220 yards by making 2:51.3. The world record is 2:47.2, made by Charlotte Boyle last year at Brighton beach pool.

Lillie Bowmer was presented the Waterhouse cup, given each year by the Waterhouse sisters, for the best all-around girl swimmer at Punahou. Lillie is a junior academy girl and it was quite a shock to the senior academy to see this happen.

Helen Moses proved the best all-around swimmer in the senior academy, beating out Mariechen Wehselau by one point. She took a first in the 50 yards, the plunge and the diving while Mariechen won the 100, 220 and 50 yards backstroke. But Helen made second in the 100, 220 and 50 backstroke which gave her the necessary margin in points.

Other Winners

The academy novice went to Peggy Ault, who scored first in the 50-yard backstroke and the dive, and won second place in the 50 free style and the 100 and third in the plunge. Dora Cooke finished second in this section and Betty Lindsay was third.

In the junior academy Lillie Bowmer was first and Helen Sanborn was second. In the junior novices Eleanor Bickerton was first by taking first places in the 50 yards and the diving and second place in the 100 yards, 220 yards and the 50 yards backstroke. Dorothy Waldron was second and Constance Davis was third.
