

EIGHT WORLD RECORDS EXPECTED TO TUMBLE

Swimming fans who have been watching Johnny Weissmuller, Illinois Athletic club star, are convinced that he will break, or help to break eight world records during the three nights of the Aloha swimming meet in Honolulu harbor this week.

Thursday night, Johnny is expected to crash four records. He will swim in the 440 yards and if leading at the end of the distance, will continue to the 500 meters mark. His time will be taken at four marks and four world records are expected to fall.

Friday night, he swims in the century and half century. In both of these events, he is figured either to break the world record or to force Pua Kealoha, Warren Kealoha or Bill Harris to crack it. The same holds true for the 220 yards in the first event Saturday night. In the 100 yards backstroke Saturday night, the winner is uncertain but a record is expected.
