

# A. A. U. Notes

Points made in junior and novice events in both swimming and track meets will be included in club scores, a decision to that effect having been made last night.

Long distance swimming will be encouraged by the local A. A. U. but just how was left to the swimming committee to be appointed.

The association treasurer suggested that the office carry a bond and a resolution was adopted to the effect that the treasurer be bonded to the amount of \$5000, the premiums to be paid by the A. A. U.

The need of having some form of annual trophy to go to high point winners was discussed and the matters left to the committees.

The suggestion that not more than one intermediate distance be timed in any event and that no track or swimming events be permitted in sanctioned meets unless over standard distances also went to the committee for discussion.

The national A. A. U. convention will be held in New York city on November 20.
