

# Seventy-Eight Swimmers Entered For Outrigger Club Meet At Pun Tank

New Zealand World Champion Women Swimmers to Clash With Honolulu, Maui and Hawaii Stars; Keen Competition Expected Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday Nights

Three score and ten and then some is the total number of swimmers entered for the big Outrigger Canoe club swimming meet scheduled next Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday nights at Punahou tank. This is one of the largest entry lists ever compiled for a tank meet in Honolulu.

The entry lists closed yesterday afternoon and showed every swimming club in Honolulu well represented. Besides that there was the Maui entry. The entry from Hawaii is through the Hui Makani club with the Keliipio sisters, who arrived here last Saturday. Keen competition is assured not only in the women's events, in which world record holders will compete, but also in the men's events, which will bring out Warren Kealoha, Sam Kahanamoku, W. W. Harris, Jr., and many others. In the women's events the chief drawing cards will be Gwith Shand and Pauline Hoeft of New Zealand and Mariechen Wehselau of the Outrigger Canoe club.

The Outrigger Canoe club has a number of dark horses for some of the events. The fans will have to do some tall guessing, but in the half century and century there is one dark horse that may pull the biggest surprise of all and beat out the world champions. No telling her name right now because it might discourage her if she lost and her name won't be told if she fails to show well. But Coach Center is so confident of her making a good showing that he has passed the word to the scribes to keep a weather eye open for her performance.

The trials on Monday night will be held in the following events:

Fifty yards men's novice, 8 entries; 40 yards women's open, 9 entries; 50 yards girls under 15, 10 entries; 50 yards girls' novice, 6 entries; 50 yards boys under 15, 8 entries; 100 yards women's open, 7 entries.

Only five of the contestants can qualify for the finals, so the eliminations Monday will cut the entries down to that number in each of the above events.
