

# Keen Races Assured With Strong Entries For All Events In Outrigger Meet

## Every Night Will Have Feature Clashes; Dark Horse Is Hitting Up Great Pace in Sprints; Backstroke Handi- cap to be One of Novel Numbers of the Tourney

Honolulu swimming fans are assured of some close races and some world records when the Outrigger Canoe club holds its meet Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday nights next week at Punahou tank, featuring Gwitha Shand and Pauline Hoelt of New Zealand, world champion women swimmers.

On the opening night, the 100 yards girls under 15 will be a tight one. Rosalie Abreu of Maui and Eleanor Bickerton of the Outrigger Canoe Club are looked upon as favorites but there is a dark horse in this race. The feature event of Monday night's meet will be the 220 yards women's free style with the two New Zealand girls swimming against Mariechen Wehselau, Helen Moses and Lillie Bowmer of the Outrigger Club and Kuaaloha Keliipio of Hilo. The Hawaiian record of 2:57 is held by Mariechen Wehselau and the world record is held by Helen Wainwright in New York. Hoelt is said to have done the distance in 2:52.

**Tuesday**  
On Tuesday night, the feature event is the 50 yards open for women. The two New Zealand girls, Mariechen Wehselau and Lillie Bowmer are figured as favorites. Pauline Hoelt holds the world record of :28.2 for this distance, while Mariechen has done it in :28.3. Bowmer has made :28.4. So it looks like a wonderful event. Just before the program closes Tuesday night there will be a 440 yards open for women. Miss Shand holds the world record for this distance at 6:16.

**Wednesday**  
On Wednesday night will be the blue ribbon event of the mermald meet with the two New Zealand girls and the local stars going after a new world record. The island record is 1:05 made by Mariechen Wehselau and the world record is 1:03.4 made by Ethelda Bleibrey.
