

OUTRIGGER SOCCER TEAM BEATS BRITONS

Playing a defensive game with only an occasional attack on the opposing goal, the Outrigger Canoe club soccer team, champions of Oahu, defeated the soccer eleven from the British cruiser Calcutta by a score of two goals to one at Makiki field this morning in an exhibition match.

The visitors outclassed the Outriggers in almost every department, but fell down lamentably in the matter of shooting. Besides that, the surfers played a strong defensive game, Henry Chillingworth, Sam Fuller and Fred Bailey working like trojans throughout. Bob Chillingworth, in goal for the surfers, was exceedingly strong.

The Outriggers kicked off but for the first few minutes it was a continual peppering of the surfers' goal. In the first attack by the surfers on the opposing goal, the British sailors held them out. Right after that Rosemond made a single handed attack but lost by inches. Calcutta renewed its bombardment and after 10 minutes continual hammering, Lewis, center forward, sent home the equalizer from a difficult angle. The half ended with the score tied at one goal.
