Demello also broke the old record with 41 ft. 7 in. Old record was 40 ft. 7 in. formerly held by Herman Clarke, 1921.

High Jump—M. Holt, Palama, first; Hipa, Palama, second; W. Holt, Palama, third; C. Luis, Palama, fourth. (Krogness did not enter although he placed in the trial). Height—5 ft. 8 1-4 in. Hawaiian record, held by G. W. Lindley, 5 ft. 10 3-4 in. made in 1918.

Broad Jump — Merchant, Olympic Club, first; Krogness, Olympic Club, second; Ault, University, third; M. Holt, Palama, fourth; Tarleton, University, fifth; Hipa, Palama, sixth. Distance—21 ft. 8 1-2 in. Hawaiian record—21 ft. 11 3-4 in. held by C. Simon since 1918. (Krogness jumped 20 ft. 2 3-4 in., Ault, 20 ft. 1 1-4 in., Holt, 19 ft. 11 3-4 in.).

16 Pound Hammer—Merchant, Olympic Club, first; Kanae, Palama, second; O'Sullivan, Palama, third; J. Cruckshank, University, fourth; Collins, University, fifth. Distance—156 ft. 19 in., breaking the record. Old record formerly held by Ludlum, 128 ft. 5 in., 1917.
