Eight Hundred Meters Relay
Made By Hui Makani Men
Is Among Those Accepted

Dorothy Waters' Records In
Breaststroke Pass and
Outrigger Relay As Well



TOTAL of 11 records made in the islands during 1923 were accepted by the National A. A. U. at its annual meeting in Detroit recently.

The complete list of records made here and accepted by the national body has just been received. It includes two records made by men and nine records made by women. Three of these island-made records were hung up by Gertrude Ederle of the New York Women's Swimming association during her visit to the islands last fall.

Johnny Weissmuller of the Illinois Athletic club and Gertrude Ederle of New York were the outstanding performers last year. Weissmuller had a total of 10 records approved besides a number of noteworthy performances.
