from the former record. She made this world's record in the Elizabeth Waterhouse tank last spring.

Her swimming has attracted world wide attention and she has been named as a probable member of the American swimming team to be sent to the Olympic meet in Paris this summer.

Mrs. May is also a member of the Outrigger Canoe Club relay team which holds a world's record in woman's 400-meter. The Outrigger team broke the record of the American team made at Antwerp in 1920.

The 17-year-old girl is one of the fastest breast-stroke swimmers in Hawaii and is classed as one of the best women divers in Hawaii.

"Dog" May has won athletic honors in track meets. His work has attracted the attention of mainland colleges who have "spoken" for him.

Last year May broke into prominence as the greatest 440 runner developed in Hawaii. He made the 440 yards in 52.2 and later clipped that mark to 51.3 in an A. A. U., meet last April.
