

# THREE ISLAND MARKS DUE FOR FALL AT MEET SATURDAY: 241 ENTRIES

Largest Number of Competitors Ever Signed Up in a Track Meet Here; Pole Vault, Mile Walk and Javelin to Be Bumped Off

**T**HREE Island records are practically sure to tumble at the A.A.U. track and field meet next week. Two other records are in serious danger.

With six strong local teams in the field, all having a chance to grab the meet, it looks like the biggest cinder affair ever staged here. The University, the Outrigger club, the Central Y.M.C.A., Palama, Hui Makani and the Cosmopolitan club, a newly organized athletic body, will all have teams in the field.

There are 241 entries in the various events, according to figures compiled by the A.A.U. officials last night. This does not include the entries from the other islands, who are expected to

have their names in by today. The Army entries in service events only are also not entered yet.

In some of the events the clubs have gone beyond the allotted six per, and the representatives will have to be present at the meeting today to scratch these, eliminating to four, or the A.A.U. will do the job for them.

The numbers of entries in the different events are: Mile run, 14; 100 yards dash, 20; 120 yards high hurdles, 10; mile walk, 5; 440 yards dash, 14; two mile run, 16; 220 yards dash, 16; 100 yards service, 1; half mile run, 11; pole vault, 9; shot put, 16; high jump, 16; broad jump, 25; discus throw, 23; 220 yards low hurdles, 6; javelin throw, 27; hammer throw, 10; 50 yards for women, 12; women's relay, 3 teams (McKinley, Punahou, Kewalo); men's relay, 4 teams (University, Central Y. M. C. A., Palama, Hui Makani).

## MAY BE BROKEN

The records which are due for upsetting are the pole vault, which Dick Gartley of the Outrigger Club, former Yale track man, is expected to sliver; the mile walk, which is being beset by Jimmy Smith and Walter Scott, both Y. M. C. A. men, who have taken the record down in practice a number of times; and the javelin throw, which has been surpassed by Jim Cruikshank of the University and Hobron of Palama.
