

Bill Bowmer Will Retire From Splash

Mrs. May, World's Fastest
Woman Swimmer, Will
Leave Game

A N N O U N C E M E N T was made yesterday by "Dad" Center, coach of the Outrigger Canoe club swimmers, of the permanent retirement of Lillie Bowmer May, holder of the world record for the 50 yards splash.

This announcement was made as a denial of an unauthorized report in an afternoon daily, indicating that Lillie is to swim in the April meet next Friday, Saturday and Sunday. She will not be in the meet, Center said.

Lillie Bowmer stopped swimming in the middle of one of the most brilliant careers of any woman swimmer. Last spring she hung up a record of :28 seconds flat in the women's century, a mark which has never been touched or approached within three-fifths of a second by any other girl.

OTHER STARS

The other Outrigger Canoe Club girl stars, Mareichen Wehselau, Helen Moses, Janice Lovett, and Dorothy Waters, will appear in the splashes this week end, and should provide a wealth of competition.

Arne Borg, famous Swedish swimmer, will appear against the local stars in the meet. He and Warren Kealoha are expected to press each other in the 440 yards swim, and a world record may result from the contest. Warren is among the world's best in this distance, and if Sam Kahanamoku is in shape, either of these three may make the grade.
