

Entry List Is Out For Harbor Swims; Borg To Try For 880-Yard Mark

Change Is Made From 800 Meters To Give Swede a Chance To Rock Charleton's Record; Locals May Edge Him

ALL of Hawaii's swimming stars are entered in the April Swimming Meet in Honolulu Harbor this week-end. The entry list, announced yesterday, indicates that Hawaii's best talent will be on the water. In the races in which Arne Borg, Swedish swim flash, appears, the lists are all boiled down to the best of Hawaii's swimmers.

The 800 meters race, which was to open the meet, has been shifted to the 800 yards splash, at the request of Borg, who pointed out that the meter distance is not a recognized splash anywhere, and there is no record in this event. Borg will attempt to lower the record of "Boy" Charlton, who set a world mark over Borg's head while the Swede was performing in the Antipodes.

The 100 meters free style event should be a classic in Hawaii's swimming annals. Warren Kealoha, Pua Kealoha, who has rubbed Duke Kahanamoku harder than any other swimmer; Sam Kahanamoku, Duke's brother and twice victor over Warren Kealoha; Clarence Lane, erstwhile national sprint champion, and several others of the pick of local talent.

Borg will appear in the 200 meters, the 400 meters and the 880 yards events. In the latter race Sam Kahanamoku will not swim, but Warren and Pua will challenge the Norse star. Sam will appear in the 440 yards, and is regarded as a likely contender against the visitor.

The races will be over a regulation 50-meter course, and the entire course will be visible from any seat.
