

# SWEDISH STAR SAYS HE WILL MAKE NEW ONE

## Meet Starts Tomorrow With Half Mile Commencing At 3:30 P. M.; Seven Events

Arne Borg, Swedish swim star who is the main attraction of the Hawaiian Olympic swimming meet Friday, Saturday and Sunday afternoons in the harbor, says he is going out to set a new record in the half mile. Borg adds that he is in great form and that he will better the 19:51.4 time made by Andrew Charlton of Australia. Borg has done better time than that. In Spain he went some seconds under that mark and he feels that he is swimming better today than ever.

His attempt to shatter the record will be made in the first event of the meet tomorrow afternoon. The meet starts at 3:30 o'clock.
