

Summary Outdoor Meet April 12, 1924

100 Meters Freestyle, Service—Olsen, Army; Conniston, Army. Time, 1:07 flat, breaking the Hawaiian service mark of 1:07.4 made by C. B. Hunt on Friday.

400 Meters Freestyle for Men—Arne Borg, Sweden; Sam Kahanamoku, Hui Nalu, and Warren Kealoha, Hui Makani, tie for second place. Time 4:59 flat, breaking his own world record of 5:06.2 and the American and Hawaiian record of 5:06.3, made by Johnny Weissmuller in 1922.

50 Meters Freestyle, for Officers—Call, Army; Stogsdell, Navy; Brand, Army. Time, :31.9, made by C. B. Hunt, who was disqualified for swimming out of his course.

200 Meters Freestyle for Men, Novice—Samson Hyun, Hui Makani; Louis Kahanamoku, Hui Nalu; W. Adler, Army. Time 2:47 flat, breaking the Hawaiian record of 2:54.2, made by Wheeldin, October, 1923.

100 Meters Freestyle for Women—Mariechen Wehselau, Outrigger; Helen Moses, Outrigger; Janice Lovett, Outrigger. Time, 1:14.1.

50 Meters Men's Freestyle—Pua Kealoha, Hui Nalu; Sam Kahanamoku, Hui Nalu; Clarence Lane, Hui Makani. Time, :27.1.

100 Meters Service Backstroke—Conniston, Army; Olsen, Army; W. Kamana, Navy. Time, 1:24.3, breaking the Hawaiian service record of 1:27.2, made by G. Kane.

50 Meters, Boys Under 15—John Wood, Y. M. C. A.; Alfred Hess, Outrigger; S. Kahanamoku, Hui Nalu; Time, :33 flat breaking the Hawaiian record of :34.3, made by E. Crabbe of Maui.

800 Meters Service Relay—Won by Navy team, consisting of Smith, Madison, Welsh and Hunt. Army second. Time, 11:26.1, breaking the Hawaiian service record of 11:32.1, made by Army October, 1923.

200 Meters Breaststroke, for Men—W. Kirschbaum, Hui Makani; Ah Pong Pang, Hui Nalu; W. Bergin, Hui Makani. Time, 3:03.2, breaking his own Hawaiian record of 3:07.1, made October, 1923.

400 Meters, Women's Relay—Outrigger team consisting of Helen Moses, Pauline Laird, Janice Lovett and Mariechen Whelselau. Time, 5:25.2.
