Just before his departure, D. I. Conkling, manager of the team, reported that \$9173.45 of the needed \$12,000 for the Olympic team fund has been raised and that he had appointed a strong local committee to carry on the work of raising the remaining \$2826.55 in the next few days.

Conkling Thanks People

"I want to thank the people of Maui and Oahu through the columns of The Star-Bulletin for raising the funds for the Olympic swimming team," were the final words of Manager Conkling before he sailed.

The members of the committee appointed are Walter F. Dillingham, Robert W. Shingle, C. S. Crane and Harry S. Hayward.

"I have not seen Mr. Dillingham but I feel confident he will serve. The others have agreed. To Mr. Shingle and Mr. Crane I have handed a list of prominent citizens who are willing to contribute but who have not yet been approached because I have not been able to find the time to do so. This committee will endeavor to complete the work of raising the remainder of the \$12,000," said Conkling.

No word has been received from the island of Hawaii, which was to have furnished \$2000 as its quota of the Olympic team fund. Hopes are still entertained that the Big Island will respond.

"Mrs. Leo and Mariechen, waiting over a week or two, will reduce the cost of the trip and result in a big saving. Also it will give Mrs. Leo who has given many hours daily to the work in connection with the team sailing, a chance to get her household affairs in order so that she can enjoy the trip without any worries about her family not being looked after properly," added Conkling.
