

WATER FETE TO BE FEATURE OF THE FAIR

Waikiki Canal Will Be
Utilized for Brilliant
Attraction

OCTOBER 30 SET

Decorated and illuminated barges representing the local boat clubs and the leading business houses and commercial and other organizations will be features of a water carnival to be staged on Waikiki Canal as the opening event of the Territorial Fair on Monday evening, October 20. This was decided on yesterday at a meeting attended by members of the committee and Col. R. McA. Schofield, president of the fair commission.

After the barges are paraded the length of the canal between McCully street and the Fair Grounds entrance they will be judged. Then the Fair Grounds, which will be in darkness until that hour will be lighted and the public admitted.

A tableaux will be staged in front of the grandstand by participants in the water carnival. At its conclusion award of prizes will be made.

BOOMED ON MAINLAND

It is proposed to make the water carnival one of the big attractions of the fair. Already it is being advertised on the mainland and is expected to attract many tourists to the exposition.

Members of the carnival are A. B. Kroll, representing Healani Club; Miss Mary Hart, Honolulu Girls Club; Miss Lani Hutchinson, Kunalu Club; Fred Wright, Myrtle Club; Dad Center, Outrigger Club; Lieut. Murray, U. S. Navy; and Sonny Cunha and Mel Nicoll, Hawaiian Rowing Association.

Special lighting arrangements along the makai bank of the canal will add to the effectiveness of the parade. A new boulevard is to be built along the canal and it is there that the crowd of spectators will assemble to watch the carnival. In addition to the fixed lighting, Col. Schofield has made arrangements for the use of a number of army searchlights which will play on the barges as they pass in review.

Attractive prizes are to be offered for various classes of entrants in the carnival. The committee has been asked by Col. Schofield to arrange the classification and to list the prizes required. This will be done at a meeting of the committee to be held two weeks hence.
