

# MARINES WIN IN OPEN EVENTS AT NUUANU SPLASH

## Good Times Made and Keen Competition Saturday At Opening of Newest Tank

Excellent times were registered in the second night's splashes of the new Westervelt swimming tank dedication meet at the Nuuanu Y. M. C. A. Saturday evening, when more than a hundred swimmers of Honolulu, of all ages, turned out. The competition in all five classes were keen and some exciting finishes were furnished to a goodly crowd of spectators, which in spite of the warnings of Jupiter Pluvius stayed on to the end of the interesting program.

Although points were not counted by clubs, the following were the results compiled by R. Rarey, who had charge of the affair and to whom much credit goes for getting the pool into shape: Women's events—Outrigger, 30 points; Punahou, 5 points; unattached, 4 points; McKinley, 3 points, and Hui Makani, 1 point. In the open events the U. S. Marine Corps nosed out the Outrigger swimmers for first honors by 16-13. The Hui Makanis and Central Y. M. C. A. men were even with 8 points each. The Live Wires were at the head of the closed Y. M. C. A. events with 30 points, while The Star-Bulletin squad was second with 24 points. The Eagle Pioneers and Atkinson Pioneers came next with 20 points each, while the Kam Hi-Y had 19 points, Employed Boys, 8 points; Central Y. M. C. A., 8 points; Go-Getter, 7 points; Emma Knights, 6 points; Greyhound, 6 points, and the Beavers, 3 points.

### Star

J. Woodd of the Kam Hi-Y was the star performer of the meet when he annexed a total of 19 points in the Class A competition. Woodd captured first places in the Senior and Class A century crawls and the 50 yards breaststroke for Class A. He also came second in the 50 yards backstroke, Class A. In all the races he won there was hot competition and exciting finishes were furnished. For the women events, Maude Kishler of the Outrigger squad shone. She took premier honors in the novices of the half-century breaststroke and crawl events. The highest individual point winner in the Senior class was Sanders of the U. S. Marine Corps with 10 points to his credit. In the Class B competitions Hosoi of the Atkinson Pioneers was first in the matter of the highest point winning mark, getting 10. Wescott of the Live Wires gathered a total of 11 points for the initial honors in Class C.
