

Heavy Surf Is Rolling: Canoe Party In Bad

Biggest Rollers Since 1906 Beat Against Beach Shore

The heaviest surf since 1906 pounded on the shores of Waikiki beach yesterday, rolling in a continuous line of foaming breakers the entire length of the beach from Castle point to Fort De Russy.

Great rollers stormed over the shore, breaking as far as a mile out at sea, and coming in with the fury of a tempest. Only a few ventured far out into the surf early in the morning, but yesterday afternoon it moderated a little, and more were able to get out to "first break."

One canoe was taken out by several members of the Outrigger Club, including Allan McGuire, "Tramp" O'Dowda, Tom Muirhead, Brady Karratti and a few others, and swamped just inside first break. A strong current carried the canoe out to sea, and a rescue party had to be dispatched to save it.

Those in the latter party were Center, Cooke, Thurston and Waters. After some difficulty they overtook the swamped canoe and managed to get the water out of it.

The waves did not abate much at low tide, and the surf is expected to be high again today.
