## SALISBURY CLUB PROVIDES A NEW L. I. GOLF CENTER

New Club at Garden City Has Three 18-Hole Golf Links.

Garden City, L. I., May 21.—With the formal opening of the Salisbury Country Club, probably one of the most complete golf clubs and restaurants in the country, going throughout this section has added scores of followers to the sport, and three 18-hole links on the Hempstead Plains have been well filled this week. Memorial Day brought down to the Garden City Hotel scores of lovers of the sport, who remained over for the week-end, and as a result of their visit the three 18-hole courses had many players throughout the week, playing from daylight till dark.

Situated on one of the highest points on the Hempstead Plains, the new Salisbury golf house commands a view of the countryside for miles. To the north and east almost every tree can readily be seen from the spacious verandas. The Meadowbrook Lodge (late of the Motor Parkway) is situated within a stone's throw of the golf house, and on the golf course grounds is Salisbury Plains railroad station.

**Is Easy to Reach.**  
These means of transportation, combined with the Jericho Turnpike, the Bethpage Turnpike, Whalenock rd and Old Country rd, all within a mile of the clubhouse are of unusual benefit to the motorists attending the day at Salisbury.

W. Chapman and C. E. Gage, two Brooklyn boys, who compete for Yale; Joe Tierney of Holy Cross, the sensation of the indoor season; Tom Campbell, N. Y. A. C. former Yale star; Jake Driscoll and Ray Robertson of the Boston A. A.; W. L. Stowers, Newark A. C., who was third in the I. C. A. A. last year; Allen Helfrich of Huntington, L. I., who competes for Penn State and N. Y. A. C.; Vincent Lally, St. Anselm's A. C., another one of our Brooklyn stars, and Vernon Ascher of Georgetown, last year's A. A. U. champion.

This race should be run in 45 3-5 seconds.

**The 800 Meters.**  
For the 800 meters there are Allen Helfrich and Schuyler Enck of Penn State, who recently ran 1:53 3-16 for the 800 yards; George Harsters of Georgetown, who has done 1:55; Pat Mahoney, Lou Welch and Tom Cavanaugh of Boston College, who ran 1:56 or better at the Penn Relays, when their team made a new world's record in the two-mile relay; Larry Brown, the former Penn star, holder of the 600-yard record, and a number of others.

**The 1,200 Meters.**  
The 1,200-meter race should show us what chance America has against Nurni, the world's record holder, for in it there will be Lloyd Hahn, Boston A. A., who did 4:19 1-8 on the boards last winter for the mile; Tom Cavanaugh of Boston College, who recently ran 4:17 4-5; "Boopy" Watters of Harvard, who is considered good for 4:20 or better; Walter Higgins, N. Y. A. C., who has broken 4:20 several times; Willie Sullivan of Georgetown, another New York boy who has run a half in 1:55 4-5 and the mile better than 4:25, and possibly Kirby of Cornell.
