

Sixty Champion Women Swimmers Here Wednesday

Sam Kahanamoku, Pua Kealoha, Warren Kealoha, W. T. Kirschbaum, Henry Luning and Charles Pung. These swimmers of the Far West Islands are bringing their musical instruments with them and will give a concert on Wednesday night, it was announced today.

The affair of Wednesday night is one of the most appealing ever offered in this city. While many advance reservations have been made, there are still a large number of good seats left. They are selling at \$7.50 each. The entire receipts will go to the Olympic fund and the committee is sorely in need of more money to send America's selected athletes abroad this summer.

The events to be contested here are 50 yard free style, 100 yard backstroke, 150 yard free style, 100 yard breast stroke and diving for the girls; 100 yard free style, 440 free style, 100 yard backstroke, 100 yard breaststroke and diving for the men. In addition there will be a 200 yard relay between the East and West. It is not unlikely that new American and world records will be established as the pick of the country will oppose each other and all are in the best of form and condition after the Olympic trials conducted over the week-end at Briarcliff Manor and at Indianapolis.

At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the American Olympic Committee, held in New York last night, the men's and women's swimming teams which will represent this country in Paris were reviewed and approved. The men were selected following the trials in Indianapolis and the women were named yesterday at Briarcliff Lodge, at which place the tests terminated yesterday.

The teams both will be the strongest that the United States ever has sent to an Olympic festival, the experts at the meeting last night said. There will be thirty-five on the men's team, while twenty-four will complete the women's squad. The report from Indianapolis stated that the events there proved conclusively that the men's squad will be an especially strong one, and the report from Briarcliff was to the same effect.

Johnny Weissmuller, the star of the men's swimming team, was among those named to compete. The Coast and Hawaii were well represented in the selections. Miss Gertrude Ederie, Miss Eileen Riggin and Miss Sybil Bauer were among the women stars named.
