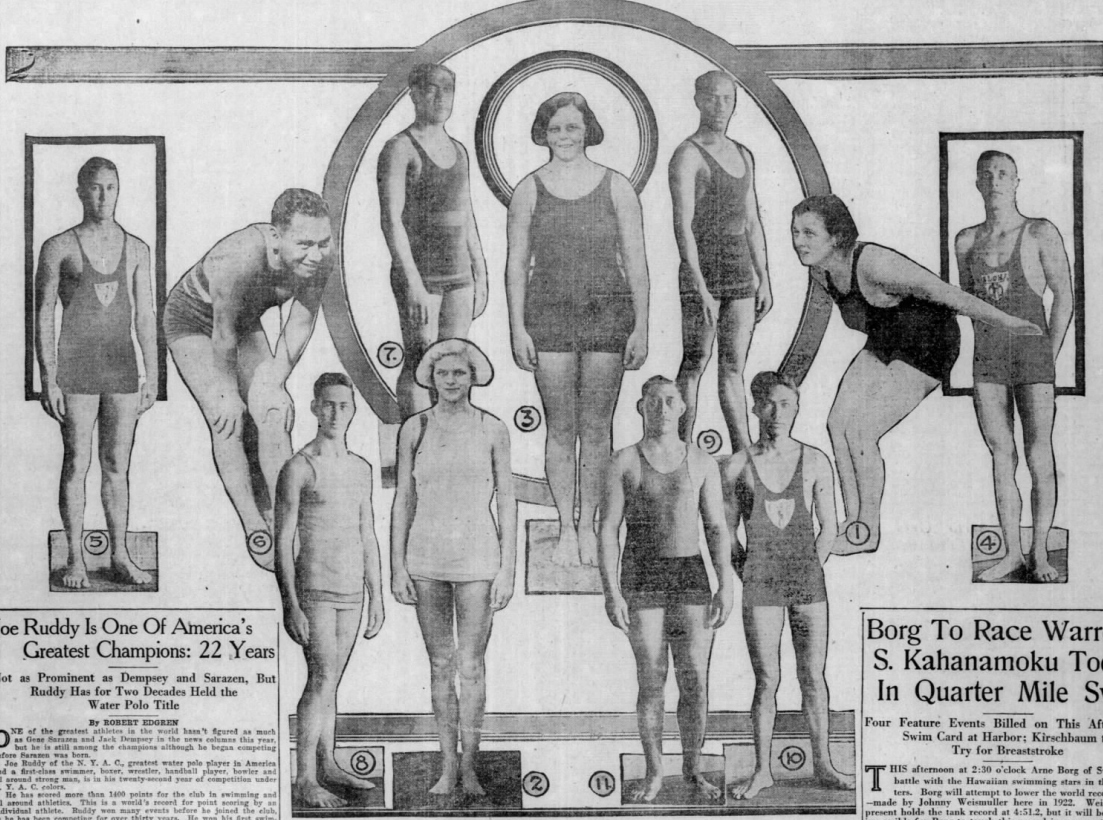


Hawaiian Aquatic Stars Who Swim Today

ONE of the greatest athletes in the world has figured as much as Gene Sarazen and Jack Dempsey in the new columns this year, but he is still among the champions although he has long competing before Sarazen was born.
 Joe Ruddy of the N. Y. A. C. greatest water polo player in America and a first-class swimmer, boxer, wrestler, handball player, bowler and all around strong man, is in his twenty-second year of competition under N. Y. A. C. colors.
 He has scored more than 1400 points for the club in swimming and all around athletics. This is a world's record for point scoring by an individual athlete. Ruddy was many years before he joined the club, as he has been competing for over thirty years. He won his first swimming race in 1895, thirty-two years ago. Joe says that he expects to go on winning for ten years more, as he feels as fast and strong and full of endurance as he did when a youngster. His trials every day.
