

Center Appoints Committees For May Swim Tests

President Center of the A. A. U. has appointed the committee on events for the big swimming meet in May. The committee is as follows: Duke P. Kahanamoku, Outrigger Club; D. L. Conkling, Hui Makani, and Ben Clarke, Palama Settlement. These three men will decide upon the order of events for the big three-day meet. Center said yesterday that every effort is being made to make this meet the greatest ever staged here.

Efforts are still being made to bring Miss Margaret Woodbridge down for the affair and in all probability Ethelda Bleibtrey, woman world's champ, will also be here. Woodbridge was the only woman to come anywhere near Bleibtrey at the Olympics. Then with local girls entered the woman's part of the meet is assured success. The men's part of the meet will be a great one. The national champions 100 yards will be swum with Duke, Pua, Warren, Kruger, Harris and others competing. This should in itself be the greatest race ever pulled off. Duke, Pua and Harris placed in the order named at the Olympics in the 100 meters. And since then Pua has come forward and broken Duke's long standing record in the 100 yards.

The other features will also be closely contested. In the backstroke, there will be Warren Kealoha, present world's champ; Stubby Kruger, former champ, and George Kane who went to the Olympics on the American Navy team. The 220 race will be a hard fought affair with Duke, Harris, Warren, Kruger, Pua and the veteran champ, Ludy Langer fighting it out.

And there are always a few dark horses who jump into view over night. Sam Kahanamoku, brother of the world's champ, is doing fast times in the 100 and should prove a surprise to local swimming enthusiasts. Harvey Chilton says he has a man who will show them a thing or two in the sprints and another in the backstroke.

After the events are announced and final arrangements made for the meet, the entry blanks will be issued.
