

# AUXILIARY APPOINTS A COMMITTEE FOR SPORTS

Women's Division of the O. C. C.  
To Commence Elaborate Plans  
For 1922 Athletic Events

At a meeting of the board of directors of the Women's Auxiliary of the Outrigger Canoe club Wednesday afternoon, much interest was shown in the swimming meet which is to be held Saturday night under the auspices of the club, and various plans were discussed as to the best manner in which to stimulate interest in swimming, especially in the schools, and so bring out new talent for future meets. In order to have this matter handled throughout the year, Mrs. Swanzy appointed a sports committee, consisting of Mrs. A. Rasch, Mrs. Russell Richards and Miss Frances Lawrence, who will look after the work in both schools and clubs in the attempt to bring them into closer touch and to pave the way for the 1922 meet. It was announced that any member of this committee will welcome suggestions in regard to these matters.

The secretary reported that she had sent out 60 notifications to women who have been on the waiting list, so that the club will soon welcome 60 new members. Nine new names passed the second reading and were placed on the waiting list. The popularity of the club's lanai as a meeting place after the afternoon swim was shown by the chaperone's report that one hundred and three parties had been held during the month, most of them being the friendly gathering of three or four around the tea table.

The sports committee will not only keep in touch with girl swimmers but hopes to make use of the volley ball court which the club maintains and in every way live up to its name.
