Outrigger unloads in regatta opener

If any doubts lingered that Outrigger Canoe Club has the ammunition to defend its state canoe racing title, they were blown out of the water along with OCC's opponents yester-

day at Kailua Beach Park. Outrigger won 10 races, including the two-mile senior men's event over arch-rival Hui Nalu, and took three second places out of 27 events in the Kamehameha Day Regatta, the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing As-

sociation's first of the season. 'Right on schedule, I'd say," said Outrigger coach Walt Guild after his paddlers ran up 77 points to runnerup Hul Naiu's 51. "Any changes (in

crews) will only strengthen us. Lanikai edged host Kailua 41-38 for third place. Healani was fifth with 28 points and Waikiki Surf sixth with 23. Twelve of the OHCRA's 14 clubs competed, including a new team, "Steamboat" Mokuahi's Hawaiian

Both clubs were even at the halfmile buoy, but Outrigger beat Hui Nalu to the turn at three-quarter miles and produced a canoe-length lead at a mile.

Hui Nalu fell back no farther, but Outrigger wasn't giving up its lead and won by two-thirds of a length. OCC was timed in 16 minutes, 47.8 seconds while Hui Nalu came in at
