# Hemmings to miss World surf test

Hawaii's 15 top surfers participating in the World Championships received eleventh hour briefings and were issued wet suits last night in the final meeting before departure Thursday to Australia.

The 12 men and three women leave at 11:59 p.m. on Qantas Airlines for a flight to Melbourne to get ready for the prestigious fifth annual World Champi-

onships scheduled for May 2 to 16.

HOWEVER, it was also announced at the meeting at the Outrigger Club that defending champion Fred Hemmings will be unable to attend the meet.

Trixie, his wife, is expecting their first child, and Hemmings wants to be with her until June, the target date, in case of complications.

Joey Cabell, three-time Makaha champ and winner of the Big Wave contest in

Peru this year, and Jock Sutherland, one of Hawaii's hottest young surfers, also will not be making the trip. Cabell injured his knee while skiing in Colorado and Sutherland was drafted.

However, alternates Tom Winkler, Greg Boeder and Don Mailer are taking the trio's places.

THE other men's contestants will be Reno Abellira, Ben Aipa, Jimmy Blears, Keone Downing, James Jones, Gerry Lopez, Dennis Pang, Randy Rarick and

Paul Strauch.

Sharon Weber and Martha and Anella Sunn will represent the women.

All fifteen surfers attended the Outrigger meeting as Hawaii's judge to the meet. George Downing issued last minute instructions and collected plane fare checks from the surfers.

Though finances were a problem, most of the surfers reached into their own pockets for round trip funding after efforts to raise the money through donations

from local businesses failed.

THREE MEMBERS, Strauch, Keone Downing and Mailer, who cut his long locks in order to be eligible for the funding, are being financed by the Outrigger Club of which they are members.

Wet suits, looking like long rubber pajamas and covering the body from neck to toes, were issued to protect Hawaii's warm blooded surfers from the 40 degree Australian waters.
