OCC Is 'Awesome' in Kam Regatta

If yesterday's Kamehameha Day Regatta, held at Kailua Beach, is an example of paddling contests to come then Outrigger Canoe Club might just as well break out the champagne and start celebrating.

The season's championship is in the bag. "Outrigger displayed awesome power today," sighed an Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association official

who asked to remain anonymous for fear of favoritism cries from HCRA's 14 other clubs on Oahu.

"OF THE 27 EVENTS, Outrigger won 10 of them and placed second or third in seven others," the official pointed out. "Hui Nalu Canoe Club was suppose to give Outrigger competition but they won only four events and were 26 points behind. This was definitely a one-sided

regatta.' OCC may have stroked off with most of the regatta's prizes, but for the thousands of canoe paddlers, race followers and spectators, Kai-

lua Beach yesterday was their paradise found.

Although the score failed to indicate as such, Hawaii Kai's Hui Nalu paddlers gave OCC a run for their medals in several events.

"I just knew that we could win if we tried," said a happy Lana Spencer, who stroked Hui Nalu's senior women to a 17-second win over the OCC's ladies.

"I'VE GOT A great crew sitting behind me," she added. "I went into this race with confidence. We trained hard for this win and the crew didn't let up a stroke."

But in the two-mile senior men's event—the regatta's blue ribbon finale—Hui Nalu tried, but failed, to topple the mighty OCC men from San South Beach.

"Watch this race." said meet director Mel Kalahiki, at the start of the senior men's event. "Watch at the way Outrigger and Hui Nalu go at it. You can feel the electricity flow between them here on shore. It's going to be a close race."

Throughout the entire two-mile heat, only scant yards separated the two crews. "Hui Nalu and OCC were pretty much together at the turns," explained Mike Lemes, the OCC steersman, "but we opened up on the straights. Close competition may be what canoe raoing is all about but I'm just happy that we won by any distance." After a grueling 16-minute, 47-second battle, OCC edged Hui Nalu by eight seconds.

OCC's winning senior men's crew consisted of Tom Conner, stroker, Marshall Rosa, Mark Buck, Tim Kelley, Bill Mowat and steersman

While outrigger and Hui Nalu were renewing their rivalries of past seasons and battling for the lead, Lanikai, Kailua and Healani crews kept in contention—seldom winning, but always pressing.

Outrigger Canoe Club and Kane-ohe established themselves as early-season powers yesterday capturing their second straight regattas in their respective associations.

Outrigger piled up 67 points to cap-ture the Oahu Hawaiian Cahoe Rac-ing Association's Pop Waialeale Regatta held off Waimanalo, while Kaneohe paddled to 47 points in the Hui Wa'a and Surfing Association's Na Keiki O Ka Mo'i Regatta off Makaha Beach.

Hui Nalu, which finished second behind Outrigger in last week's OHCRA Leeward Kai Regatta, placed second again with 63 points followed by Kailua with 36 points.

Canoe Honors to Outrigger, Kaneohe Clubs

Outrigger Canoe Club overcame a three-second penalty on the final race of the day to hold off a determined Hui Nalu effort and win its second Oahu Canoe Racing Association regatta in as many weeks.

Outrigger's senior men's crew, comprised of Tom Conner, Marshal Roza, Mark Buck, Tim Kelley, Bill Mowatt and Mike Lemes, was assessed a three-second penalty for hitting the 4-mile flag in their two-mile race but still took a six-second victory—with a time of 16 minutes, 39.3 seconds—over Hui Nalu to keep OCC unbeaten.

The final-race victory enabled OCC, which ran away with last week's regatta, to take the "Pop" Waialeale regatta by a scant four points, 67-63, over host Hui Nalu.

MEANWHILE, THE Hui Wa'a and Surfing Association held its Na Keiki O Ka Moi Regatta at Makaha Beach, with favorite Kaneche posting a comfortable win, finishing with 47 points to second-place Loa'a's 31.

The dramatic conclusion to the Waialeale

regatta was set up by the Hui Nalu senior women, who won the second to last race of the day, a one-mile event. The Hui Nalu women-Lana Spencer, Nalani Spencer, Christine Gibson, Ann

Schumaker, Carol Kukea and Lila Blankenfeld-breezed to an 18-second victory over Outrigger, winning the race in a time of 9 minutes, 41.5 seconds.

OCC posted three consecutive wins, in the quarter-mile girls' 13-and-under, the quarter-mile women's novice 'A' and the boys' quarter-mile 14-and-under races, to take a big early lead. OCC also won the women's masters mile and freshmen men's mile races.

HUI NALU POSTED wins in the mixed quarter-mile; the boys' 16; men's open and junior women's races.

Kaneohe overcame fast starts by Loa'a and Kamehameha canoe clubs and finally built up a comfortable lead with its intermediate crews to win the Na Keiki O Ka Moi Regatta.

The powerful Windward canoe club won the men's novice 'B' half-mile race; the women's novice 'A' half-mile race; the men's novice 'A' three-quarter-mile race and the women's sophomore mile race.

Koolau took the OCRA's Division II title this week with 22 points, while Hui Lanakila finished second with 13.
