# Beach Boys claim sand, surf and title

The sun beat down on Waikiki Beach with merciless 90-plus degree intensity, and everywhere people sought shelter from the heat. It was found in the water, under makeshift tents, and in spirits sipped from beer bottles and high ball glasses.

Peter Apo, president of the Hui Wa'a and Surfing Association, claimed a spot under a yellow-and-white beach umbrella procured from one of the hotels on the strip and gazed out at the ocean.

Offshore, HWSA paddlers stroked furiously as they tried to catch one of the one-to-three-foot swells that broke about 200 yards from the beach. Suddenly a cheer went up. A wave had picked up one of the outriggers and was carrying it along, past other outriggers, as it surged toward shore.

"That's the great thing about surf racing," Peter Apo said. "You draw a good lane and you catch a good wave and you've got it made. That's what makes surf racing so much fun. It's anybody's race."

But it wasn't. Yesterday, for the fourth time in its four-year history, the HWSA's Waikiki Beach Boys Regatta belonged to the club that draws its coaches and steersmen from the Beach Services Departments of the Outrigger and the Sheraton and the Moana and the Hilton.

The Waikiki Beach Boys, buoyed by the performances of its senior women, senior men and men's Open-Four crews, paddled to a come-from-behind victory over Loa'a, which had won all six HWSA regattas held this year and had a seven-regatta win streak dating from last year's HWSA state championships.

The Beach Boys scored 51 points; Loa'a 46. Ka Mo'i, with 44, was third, followed by Lokahi (43) and Kamehameha (42). Also competing were Windward Kai (16), Koa Kai (13), Kaneohe (12), Pohai Ke Aloha (8), Kai Po'ha (6), Hawaiian Outrigger (3) and Hawaii Kai (2).

In the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association's regatta at Makaha Beach, Hui Nalu outscored Outrigger Canoe Club 78-65 for its eighth victory in nine regattas. Healanani was third with 56.

"I work here on the beach, and all my steersmen work here, too," said Beach Boys coach Moku Kamaka. "We all work for the hotels . . . we know the beach, we know the waters."

"Hey — we gotta win here. This is our place. Something's wrong if we can't win at Waikiki Beach."

After 21 of the 25 events had been completed, it appeared Loa'a would extend its regatta win streak to eight. The Kaneohe-based club had amassed 46 points to the Beach Boys' 42, and its men's Open-Four

crew (a four-time winner this year) was the only finishing crew from either team favored to win its event.

But Loa'a would not score another point. And the Beach Boys would finish first in the 1½-mile senior women's race and second in the 2½-mile senior men's and ¼-mile men's Open-Four events.

The eight-point victory that gave the Beach Boys the regatta lead was earned by its senior women's crew (Ginette Huddy, Boni Huddy, Tina Huddy, George Chun, Jaysa Akiona and Kimberly Merino), which successfully negotiated the swell that swamped Kaneohe and Loa'a outriggers.

The importance of the victory, one week before the HWSA's state championships, was not lost on Kamaka. "When you beat Loa'a, it really gets your adrenalin going," he said. "We've got confidence in ourselves now. We'll give them a run for their money next week."

When Hui Nalu Canoe Club coach Kala Kukea says he hopes his team hasn't peaked yet, you have to wonder how high his goals are.

After all, his team looked very fit yesterday in winning the Healanani Regatta at Keahi Lagoon — its sixth victory in seven Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association regattas this season.

Hui Nalu scored 67 points. Defending regatta champion Healanani finished second with 54 and Outrigger Canoe Club, winner of last week's MacFarlane regatta, was third with 52.

Kala Kukea says he feels the proper time for a club to peak is during the OHCRA's Oahu and State championship regattas, which will be held next month.

Still, he couldn't help but be pleased with his crews' performances in the flat waters against occasional gusts of wind he described as having "dustbowl-weather" traits.

Hui Nalu began yesterday's competition by sweeping the three events in the 12-year-old division. "The kids have been all right," Kukea said. "They've been keeping up in the ball game."

But Healanani won five of the next 13 events and finished second three times to take the lead. After the men's sophomore race — the 19th of 27 events — Healanani led Hui Nalu 45-39.

That brought up the 20th event, which normally is the men's open-four race. However, OHCRA teams voted prior to the race to amend an experimental rule change that would move the two senior events, usually the last two races of the regatta, into the 20th and 21st spots. According to race director Mel Kalahiki, the move was made so that the spectators who normally leave a regatta early would be able to witness the long-distance races.

The move turned out to be a good one for Hui Nalu, which won both races. With each first-place finish worth eight points, Hui Nalu took a 55-45 lead with the sweep. Hui Nalu was never caught after that.

Hui Nalu's senior women won their race in 18:58.3, a half-second faster than the Outrigger squad.

"We've been wanting this win. (OCC) won the last two," said Carol Kukea, a member of the crew.

The victory was more remarkable since two of Carol Kukea's teammates, Lindsey Styan and Trish Gallagher, had competed in the Tinman Triathlon before the race.

Hui Nalu then won the women's junior event and finished second in the men's masters 40 to clinch the victory.

"We try to do good from crew to crew," Kala Kukea said. "It's fun to win. But it's better to go out and make sure everyone's had a good time and is treated fairly."

In the Hui O Koolauloa Regatta at Kahana Bay, strong cross currents and choppy water water conditions did not stop the Loa'a Canoe Club from winning its sixth consecutive regatta over a two-year period.

Loa'a won eight of 25 events to finish with 63 points. The Kamehameha Canoe Club and the Lokahi Canoe Club were tied for second with 39.
