## Outrigger triumphs in Kam Day regatta

Waikiki Surf Club took the top two races — senior men and women events but the Outrigger Canoe Club won the annual King Kamehameha Day Regatta championship yesterday off Kailua Beach

Outrigger finished first in five of the fourteen races, and took three seconds and two thirds for a 40 point total, while Waikiki managed to garner three other first places for a total of 31.

THE CONDITIONS for the season's first regatta were good, with light winds and sunshine as more than 3,000 lined the beach for the event.

The Waikiki senior men paddlers completed the 21/2 mile course in 24:19.2, 41.4 seconds ahead of second place Outrigger. Healani finished third in 25:41.0.

The Waikiki senior women's winning time for their 1 mile course was 12:13.7.

The most exciting race of the day turned out to be the men's novice event which had two canoes from Waikiki and Healani swamping. And just before the finish line, Healani overtook Outrigger to win first place by a half a canoe length. Healani's time for that half mile course was 4:46.2. Outrigger finished a second later.
