#### MacFarlane Regatta tomorrow

Outrigger will defend its title, won last year in the memorial regatta that is held each year on the Fourth of July. A trophy donated by Matson will be the first-place prize for the nine-lane surf event in front of the Moana Hotel.

Bill Cook, chairman for OCC canoe racing, said the regatta is named for Walter J. Mac-Farlane, a businessman and legislator in Hawaii, who died in 1943 while serving as president of OCC. He built a new club after obtaining a sublease from Matson and the building stood where the Outrigger Hotel is
