Seasmoke, donated to Boy Scouts by James Arness, was outdistanced yesterday by Sea Bird enroute to Multihull Transpac finish here today.

The 44-foot catamaran Sea Bird is expected to arrive noon today off Diamond Head as the winner of the fourth bien nial Multihull Transpacific Yacht Race, according to reports from the crafts early last night.

The victory for Sea Bird will cap a nip-and-tuck race with rival Seasmoke, which only yesterday morning was tied with the leader 340 miles off Hawaii.

HOWEVER, skipper Bob Hanel's lighter and shorter craft pulled away and left the 58-foot Seasmoke far behind.

Seasmoke is expected to cross the finish line seven hours later at 7 p.m.

James "Matt Dillon" Arness, the former owner who donated the cat cutter Seasmoke to the Boy Scouts of America, is in Hawaii to greet the finishers.

Glass Slipper II was reported a distant third, 475 miles off Honolulu during yesterday morning reports. She is expected to finish tomorrow evening.
