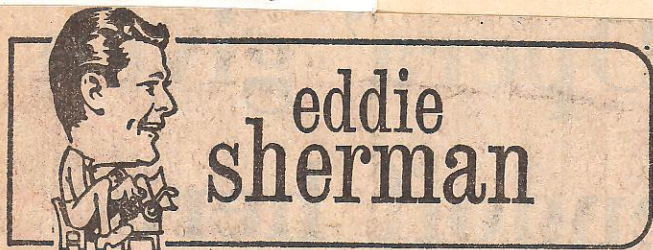

Oahuan Takes Early Billfish Lead

KAILUA, Kona — Steve Parker, a member of the Oahu Outrigger Canoe Club's team No. 2, hooked the first fish of the 12th annual Hawaiian International Billfish Tournament at 8:30 a.m. today.

Two other marlin were reported caught, both by overseas teams, in the first roundup of fishing results at 10 a.m. this morning.

Fighting time on Parker's marlin, caught aboard the "Kipe Kona," was 31 minutes. The fish was brought to the Kailua pier at 10 a.m. and weighed in at 147 pounds. A small tuna was found in the fish's belly.

The other marlin were caught by an unidentified member of the American Samoa team, whose catch was listed at 165

pounds, and Harold Biaggini, of Mexico-Cal Sportsmen's Club of Mexico, who had an estimated 130-pound catch.

The tournament got off to a smooth start this morning with a radio signal punctually at 8 a.m. which told anglers to "start fishing."

Charter boats strung out in a double line across Kailua Bay from Thurston Point to Sam Pua Point where awaiting the signal.

The Kailua Pier had been charged with excitement as anglers milled about waiting to board their boats this morning.

Hundreds of fishermen, well wishers and spectators thronged the pier as actor Richard Boone, president of the Kona Game Fishing Club, and tournament chairman Peter Fithian herded the anglers onto their charter boats.

After the last bit of tackle was stowed and the last fisherman

was safely aboard, the boats moved out into their starting places on either side of the Coast Guard craft. Calls of "good luck" followed the departing boats, as spectators moved toward the end of the pier to await the starting signal.

Then the starting order was issued and the boats began turning out into the deep water, while keyed-up anglers anticipated the first strikes of the big ones.

The boats were to radio the first roundup of fishing results to fishing headquarters at 10 a.m., followed by more roundups at noon and 3 p.m.

Tuesday for the first time boats will be allowed the option of departing from any of three points—Kailua, Keauhou or Honokohau harbors.

Fishing will commence daily at 8 a.m. and end at 5 p.m., with three radio roundups of results.
